Action(s)	Measurable/Observable Results
Administration and staff will review the current	

intervention schedule and look for ways to provide Tier II and Tier III support for students in math.	
The school staff will collect and regularly review assessment data to ensure that students are receiving Tiered support in the appropriate content area.	
Provide staff Professional Development opportunities on early release days and Curriculum Hours to review student data.	
Create and maintain a database of common assessments that will be used to measure growth in mathematics.	
Implement a consistent Common Planning Time for each grade-level team, with building administrators and student support staff meeting with the teams during this time three times per month to review assessment data, track student progress, plan necessary adjustments to curriculum and instruction, and provide support as needed.
