

# Voter Registration Toolkit

Goal: Register 25,000 Black voters before the 2026 Midterm Election: [Join the GroupMe](#)

## The Mission

---

In response to the Supreme Court decision to gut Section 2 of the Voting Rights Act, we are launching a national campaign to register Black voters. We're meeting our people where they are, and making our voices too loud to ignore.

### Our 8 Priority States

Alabama · North Carolina · Louisiana · Mississippi · Georgia · South Carolina · Tennessee · Texas.

These are the states most affected by the Supreme Court ruling, but also where the unregistered Black voter pool is large enough to change the outcome of key races. If you live in one of these states, now is the time to activate.

*Not in one of these states? Recruit someone who is. Share the toolkit. Post the registration link. Amplification is activation.*

### Where We Show Up

We show up in spaces Black people already occupy - salons and barbershops, churches, trail rides Juneteenth celebrations, cookouts and block parties, and college campuses.

### Your Three Jobs

1. **Ask first.** Ask the people in your life if they're registered to vote.
2. **Find a space.** Find a space in your city to show up and register voters. Post it in your state GroupMe.
3. **Recruit.** Recruit one more person. Share this toolkit. Drop the GroupMe link. Bring someone in.

## Juneteenth — Our National Activation Day

---

### The Juneteenth Plan

1. **Find an event.** Find the biggest Juneteenth event in your city.
2. **Contact the organizer.** Reach out to the organizer now. Say: "I'm with the 92% Club — a national voter registration initiative. Can we set up a free civic table at the event?"
3. **Post in your state group.** Post it in your state GroupMe when it's confirmed. Others can join.
4. **Know your rules.** Read your state's rules in Section 3 before you show up anywhere.
5. **Show up ready.** Show up with a tablet linked to your state's voter registration portal or with paper forms.
6. **Log your results.** Log your registrations in the 92% Club reporting form after the event. [92% Club Reporting Form](#)

#### WHAT TO BRING TO YOUR JUNETEENTH DRIVE

Required: Charged tablet or phone · State registration portal bookmarked · Black pen · Paper forms for your state (Mississippi: paper only — no online registration)

Recommended: Small sign — "Register to Vote · Free · Fast" · Something to give people who register · Portable charger

Texas only: You must be a certified VDR before collecting any paper forms. See Texas section.

## Your State's Rules

Rules are different in every state. Read your state below before you show up anywhere.

✓ **Green** — Open, anyone can help register voters    ⚠ **Amber** — Org must register first    ⚡ **Red** — Required certification or serious penalties

# AL

## Alabama

Registration deadline: October 5, 2026

✓ **OPEN — NO  
RESTRICTIONS**

### ANYONE CAN REGISTER VOTERS IN ALABAMA

No permit, certification, or pre-registration required. Show up with a tablet for online registration or paper forms.

Online registration: [alabamainteractive.org](http://alabamainteractive.org) — needs a valid AL driver's license or state ID

Paper forms: Download at [sos.alabama.gov](http://sos.alabama.gov) — submit to county Board of Registrars within one week

Photo ID required at polls: AL driver's license, passport, or government-issued ID. Free voter ID available from SoS.

# NC

## North Carolina

Registration deadline: Oct 9, 2026 + same-day during early voting

✓ **OPEN — NO  
RESTRICTIONS**

### OPEN — WITH A BONUS: SAME-DAY REGISTRATION DURING EARLY VOTING

No restrictions. Anyone can help register voters.

NC offers same-day registration during early voting — even people who miss Oct 9 can register when they show up to vote early.

Watch: Pending bill H 127 would restrict third-party drives from distributing paper forms. NOT law yet. Monitor for updates.

Photo ID required at polls: NC driver's license, U.S. passport, military ID, or free voter ID from county Board of Elections.

# LA

## Louisiana

Registration deadline: October 5, 2026

⚠ **ORG MUST REGISTER  
FIRST**

### ⚡ READ BEFORE ANY LOUISIANA DRIVE

Louisiana law requires third-party organizations to register with the SoS before collecting paper forms. Penalty: up to \$2,000 fine or up to two years imprisonment.

To register: Email [outreach@sos.la.gov](mailto:outreach@sos.la.gov) — submit the Voter Registration Drive Contact Form before any paper drives.

Easiest path — online-only drives: Louisiana law explicitly exempts online-only drives. Bring a tablet, let people register themselves at [geauxvote.com](http://geauxvote.com) — no org registration needed.

If collecting paper forms: submit to parish Registrar of Voters within 30 days.

Photo ID required at polls: LA driver's license, state ID, U.S. passport, or military ID.

**MS****Mississippi**

Registration deadline: October 3, 2026 — EARLIEST DEADLINE

✓ OPEN — PAPER FORMS ONLY

**OPEN — BUT NO ONLINE REGISTRATION IN MISSISSIPPI**

Anyone can help. No restrictions. But Mississippi has no online voter registration — every person must fill out a paper form.

Always bring physical forms: Download at [sos.ms.gov](https://sos.ms.gov) before every drive.

Submit completed forms to the local Circuit Clerk's office. Mississippi closes October 3 — the earliest of all 8 states. Start early.

Photo ID required at polls: MS driver's license, state ID, military ID, U.S. passport, or free MS Voter ID card from the circuit clerk.

**GA****Georgia**

Registration deadline: October 5, 2026

⚠️ ORG MUST REGISTER WITH SOS

**CONFIRM ORG REGISTRATION BEFORE COLLECTING PAPER FORMS**

Georgia requires third-party organizations to register with the Secretary of State before collecting paper forms. Confirm 92% Club is registered — contact Camille to verify before any Georgia paper drives.

Recommended approach — online-only drives: Bring a tablet, direct people to [registertovote.sos.ga.gov](https://registertovote.sos.ga.gov). Online-only drives do not require org registration.

Check registration: [mvp.sos.ga.gov](https://mvp.sos.ga.gov)

Photo ID required at polls: GA driver's license (can be expired), public university student ID, or government-issued photo ID.

**SC****South Carolina**

Registration deadline: October 4, 2026

✓ OPEN — NO RESTRICTIONS

**OPEN — CURRENTLY NO RESTRICTIONS**

Anyone can help register voters. Submit completed paper forms to the State Election Commission or county voter registration office within one week.

Online: [scvotes.gov](https://scvotes.gov) · Check status: [scvotes.gov/voter-registration-status](https://scvotes.gov/voter-registration-status)

Watch: Pending bill H 3459 would require org registration and a 10-day submission window. NOT law yet.

Photo ID required at polls: SC driver's license, SC DMV ID, U.S. passport, military ID, or SC voter registration card with photo.

**TN****Tennessee**

Registration deadline: October 5, 2026 — no same-day registration

⚠️ RESTRICTIONS APPLY

**READ BEFORE ANY TENNESSEE DRIVE**

Paper forms collected at drives must be submitted to the county election commission within 15 days.

Complete the free SoS training first: [sos.tn.gov/govotetn](https://sos.tn.gov/govotetn) — it's quick and protects you.

Easiest path: Direct people to [ovr.govote.tn.gov](https://ovr.govote.tn.gov) for online registration. No form submission rules apply.

Tennessee has NO same-day registration. October 5 deadline is firm. Start early.

Photo ID required at polls: TN driver's license, U.S. passport, government-issued photo ID, military ID, or TN handgun carry permit with photo.



Texas

Registration deadline: October 5, 2026

VDR CERTIFICATION  
REQUIRED

### ⊖ MUST BE A CERTIFIED VOLUNTEER DEPUTY REGISTRAR (VDR) TO COLLECT FORMS IN TEXAS

Texas law requires anyone collecting completed voter registration applications to be a certified VDR appointed by their county voter registrar. Collecting forms without certification is a Class C misdemeanor.

Texas online registration is NOT fully online — applicants must still print and mail the form. VDR certification is the only effective path for drive-based registration.

Your VDR certification is county-specific — you can only collect forms from voters in your county.

GET CERTIFIED BEFORE JUNETEENTH. Training is free, approximately 1 hour.

## Get People Into the Coalition

The 92% Club grows person by person, bring people in to join the movement!

### Start Here — Ask the People in Your Life

Text 5 people right now and ask: "Hey, are you registered to vote?" If they say no or aren't sure, send them your state's registration link. That's it. You just ran a voter registration drive.

### Ask People to Join the 92% Club

#### FOUR WAYS TO START THE CONVERSATION

Personal: "We're building a voter registration network, and I immediately thought of you. I can add you to the GroupMe if you want to get involved.

Direct: "We're registering 25,000 Black voters across 8 states before the midterms. We need someone who knows the community. Are you in?"

Simple: "Have you heard about the Supreme Court ruling? We're doing something about it." Then send this toolkit link.

### Once They Say Yes — Three Steps

**Step 1:** Add them to the main 92% Club GroupMe

**Step 2:** Add them to their state GroupMe.

**Step 3:** Send them this toolkit link and tell them to read their state's section.

## How to Secure a Juneteenth Table

---

Getting a voter registration table at a Juneteenth event is easier than you think. Most organizers welcome it.

1. **Find the event:** Find the biggest Juneteenth event in your city. Google "[your city] Juneteenth 2026." Check Facebook Events and Instagram.
2. **Find the organizer:** Find the organizer through the event's social media or venue website.
3. **Make the ask:** Make the ask: "I'm with the 92% Club — a national voter registration initiative. Can we set up a voter registration table at your event?"
4. **Cross-promote:** Offer to cross-promote: "We'll share your event with our network and tag you on social."
5. **Confirm:** Confirm in writing — even a text is fine. Get the date, arrival time, and where you'll be set up.
6. **Post it:** Post it in your state GroupMe when it's confirmed.

### READ YOUR STATE'S RULES BEFORE YOU SHOW UP

Louisiana and Georgia require org pre-registration before collecting paper forms.

Texas requires VDR certification — get certified NOW if you haven't.

The online-only approach is the safest path in most states — bring a tablet, let people register themselves, and you're covered in AL, NC, MS, SC, and TN.
