Abstract: Write your abstract here. The last sub (5) contains the organization of articles in each section (a little bit of exploration on the flows of your discussion and the expected final results will be good points for closing this introduction section).

The citation format used in this article is the Chicago Manual of Style 17 edition (full note) displaying DOI and /URL/ISSN.

## Literature Review

This section explains the core concepts of the research and defines key terms within the research context, referring to relevant academic literature. This section can be explained in several sub-chapters.

The most important aspect of this section is not just summarizing but synthesizing: connecting research to form a logical flow. It demonstrates the contribution of the literature in building a theoretical framework for the research being written.

#### Method

The Method section describes in detail how the study was conducted, including conceptual and operational definitions of the variables used in the study, Different types of studies will rely on different methodologies; however, a complete description of the methods used enables the reader to evaluate the appropriateness of your methods and the reliability and the validity of your results, It also permits experienced investigators to replicate the study, If your manuscript is an update of an ongoing or earlier study and the method has been published in detail elsewhere, you may refer the reader to that source and simply give a brief synopsis of the method in this section.

In this Part, authors should follow the direction: (1) Use Past Tense; (2) Justify why each one of your methodological choices is appropriate and scientifically sound. (3) Sampling: target population, research context, units of analysis, respondent demographic and behavioral profile, sampling method (disadvantages for generalizability, target sample size and how to determine, realized sample size, response rate, number of questionnaires etc.

## Results and Discussion

In the Results section, summarize the collected data and the analysis performed on those data relevant to the discourse that is to follow. Report the data in sufficient detail to justify your conclusions. Mention all relevant results, including those that run counter to expectation; be sure to include small effect sizes (or statistically nonsignificant findings) when theory predicts large (or statistically significant) ones. Do not hide uncomfortable results by omission. Do not include individual scores or raw data with the exception, for example, of single-case designs or illustrative examples. 


Diagram 1. Xxxxxxxxx (above)
