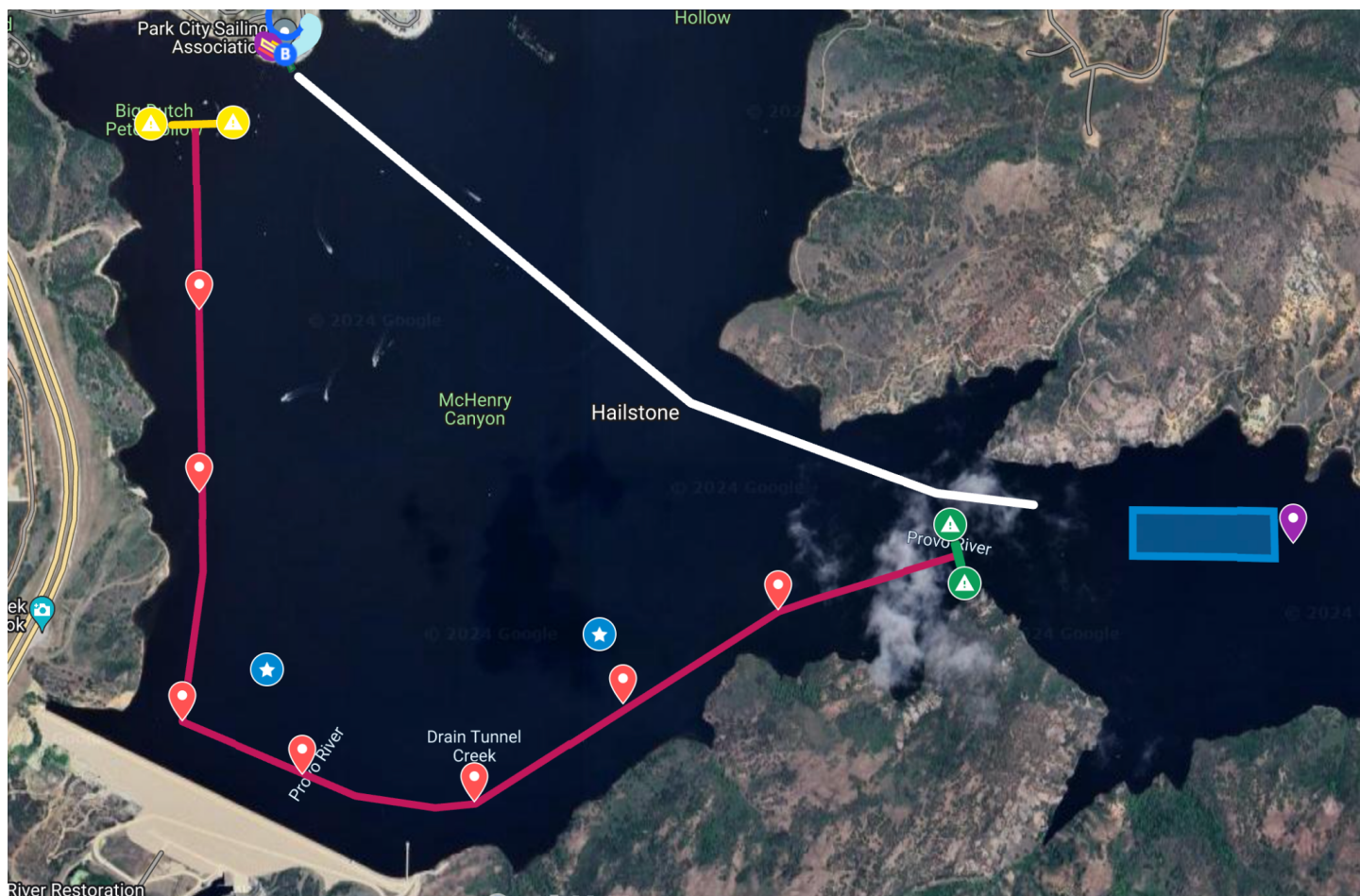

2024 Wasatch Mountain Head - Regatta Specific Rules

The 2024 Wasatch Mountain Head course involves several sharp turns around buoys in a very exposed open reservoir. The ability to safely and effectively pass another crew (or allow room for a crew to pass) is an important aspect of racing on this course. There could be situations in which passing cannot be accomplished without endangering a crew; it is the responsibility of the passing crew/coxswain to recognize these situations and avoid them.

Specific responsibilities of scullers and crews are as follows:

1. The boat overtaking (Passer) has the right of way to pass (on the port side) if a safe pass can be accomplished. A boat is considered to be overtaking when it moves within one boat length of open water of a boat ahead.
 - a. If a pass is attempted and there is not adequate room and time to perform the pass, the Passer is at risk of incurring interference penalties.
 - b. If passing on a turn, the Passer must give adequate room to the boat being overtaken to allow it to complete its turn safely.
 - c. If a pass is attempted and the overtaken crew does not yield, the Passer shall not press the issue. If the Passer causes a collision in this way, the Passer may receive a penalty
2. The boat being overtaken (Passees) must yield to the starboard side and give suitable room to the Passer to pass on the port side, given a safe pass can be accomplished. Failure to yield carries a presumed penalty of 60 seconds.
3. Interference carries a presumed penalty of 60 seconds. Repeated or severe interference may result in exclusion.
4. Each Buoy taken on the wrong side of the hull may result in a 60-second penalty. During racing, boats must stay on the course. Oars blades may go over the buoys but the hull of the shell must stay between the buoy line and the shore. If a boat exits the course, they may return when it is safe and continue their race.
5. Any crew showing a blatant disregard for safety will likely be excluded. 'Blatant disregard' includes but is not limited to:
 - a. Failure to heed the instructions of the starting official.
 - b. Crossing into the racing pattern while not racing.
6. All crews must finish the race with ALL competitors on board.
 - a. Fours and eights must have their coxswains.
 - b. ALL rowers must be in the boat.
7. Use of profanity may result in an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty of 60 seconds.
8. Racing delays due to wind and weather will be determined and announced on site
9. Changes to online schedule and results will be made on site
10. Medals will be awarded for competitors 1st through 3rd

Youth Team Points Trophy

Scoring for the team points trophy is as follows:

1st Place - 4 points

2nd Place - 2 points

3rd Place - 1 point

Uncontested races - no points scored, medals still awarded

Jordanelle State Park Rules

1. Day Use is 6 AM to 10 PM
2. Off-Highway Vehicle (OHV) use is prohibited.
3. All Utah Boating Laws are strictly enforced.
4. Explosives, fireworks and firecrackers are prohibited.
5. No discharge of firearms allowed in developed park areas. Refer to proclamation for hunting and fishing guidelines.
6. Fires are permitted in designated pits only. No ground fires are allowed.
7. Firewood gathering is prohibited.
8. PITCH-IT-IN! Please use trash receptacles and recycling bins provided.
9. Park in designated areas only. Park on pavement only. ALL tires must be ON pavement. Violators may be cited and/or towed.
10. Dogs must be on a 6' or shorter leash and attended to at all times. Pets are prohibited from public buildings.
11. Service dogs are always welcome.
12. All pet waste must be cleaned up and disposed of properly.
13. Drones are permitted for personal use only with permit and approval from park management.
14. Metal detecting is permitted with permit and approval from park management.
15. Vehicles must remain on designated roads. NO motor vehicle use allowed on beaches or shoreline.

Schedule Updating

Depending on the number of entries received, the schedule could change to account for that. The Final Schedule will be posted and sent out to everyone a couple days before hand once registration is closed.

Results and Awards

Results will be posted online on the results tab of RegattaCentral. First through third place medals will be awarded

Boat Storage

Boats can be stored on trailers, in the Park City Sailing Club parking lot on slings or low boys. Please keep the rocky shoreline east and west of the boat ramp clear for launching and returning boats.

Launching/Returning

All crews will be launching from the Park City Sailing Club boat ramp and the rocky shoreline to the east of the boat ramp. Please prepare for a wet-launch, and be sure to walk your boat out deep enough so you don't break your skeg or damage your hull. Water temperature at this time of year is mid 60s F and air temperature can range from 30s F in the early morning to 70s F by mid morning. Returning boats and all boats hot seating will return to the shoreline west of the boat ramp and either exit the water there or add the hotseating crew and proceed towards the starting line.

Bow Balls and Competitor Numbers

No shell may be launched without a bow ball. At registration, each race entry will be given a bow number. Make sure your bow number is right side up and not upside down. Heel ties will be checked as well before launching. A volunteer will be collecting bow numbers for all boats as they return to the shore. Bow numbers not returned will incur a \$10 fee per bow number missing.

Parking (Trailer/Vans)

Trailers will park in the angled parking stalls adjacent to the Park City Sailing Association. Spectators, please park to the east of the boat ramp, near the park building and the public restrooms. All spectators are expected to pay for parking, either upon entry or exit from the venue.

Eastbound on US-40

- Take exit 8 for Mayflower
- Turn left to cross the overpass
- Continue straight on Deer Hollow Road
- Proceed through the State Park Check-In Station
- Turn right, following signs for Sail PC
- Turn right again, following signs for Sail PC
- Continue straight and park adjacent to the park building & public restrooms

Westbound on US-40

- Take exit 8 for Mayflower
- Turn right
- Continue straight on Deer Hollow Road
- Proceed through the State Park Check-In Station
- Turn right, following signs for Sail PC
- Turn right again, following signs for Sail PC
- Continue straight and park adjacent to the park building & public restrooms
