Here is a "checklist" for setting up your first grade classroom. Design towards setting up the classroom environment to support student's independence, access and belonging. It's a lot! Before digging in, seek support from your site admin and colleagues. Likely many of the materials here are already taken care of at the site level, once you ask. These materials are not specific to content. Please refer to content checklists for student materials needed for each content.
