COMPOSITION FOUNDATIONS (8:30 - 10:00) CLOSED

Generally Grades 8-9

Composition Foundations is a skills-based class for students entering the LIFT English program. This grammar intensive class equips students with the strong foundation they will need for success in all other LIFT English classes. We will also cover writing concepts in preparation for Comp 1. By the end of the year, students should be able to identify all parts of speech and types of sentences.

No assessment is necessary to enroll in this class.

***INSTRUCTOR BIO:**

My goal for my students is to prepare them thoroughly for any type of writing that will be required of them post high school. While not everyone will attend a college, we all must communicate in writing in some form or the other. COMPOSITION 1 (12:15-1:45) (AN ADDITIONAL CLASS MAY BE OFFERED AT 10:15-11:45 IF THIS CLASS CLOSSES)

Generally Grades 9-11

Composition 1 is a skills-based class offering students experience in a variety of essay writing styles as well as literature analysis. The students will begin the year with review of quality sentence writing including punctuation. *Students are expected to have mastered grammar before entering this class.* Essay writing will follow with a focus on the organizational process of writing, developing an idea, outlining, and organizing the essay. Thesis statements and paragraph organization will be developed to enable proficiency in writing quality essays. Most of the year will be spent focusing on understanding and practicing various types of essays. Proofreading skills will be taught as students correct their own essays. Through use of active reading journals and class discussion, students will practice the ability to read and analyze the content of various types of literature and poetry.

PREREQUISITE: Successful completion of Composition Foundations or taking the assessment.

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COMPOSITION 2/ AMERICAN LITERATURE. (2:00-3:30)

Generally Grades 10-12

Composition 2/American Literature is a skills-based class offering students experience in higher-level writing exercises. Each essay will be an evaluation of an American literary work. Students will learn MLA citations for the literature books as well as a limited number of web sources and AVL sources. Through use of active reading journals and class discussion, students will practice the ability to read and analyze the content of various types of literature and poetry for use in their essays.

This is not an entry-level course. The reading volume required in Comp 2 is very demanding.

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CRITICAL THINKING AND CREATIVE WRITING (10:15-11:45) CLOSED

Generally Grades 10-12

Critical Thinking and Creative Writing is a class born from the realization that modern students have not had the opportunity to develop the critical thinking skills necessary for life. In this age, any answer to any question is a simple click of a button away. Problem solving is relegated to electronic solutions. This class **will count as an English credit**; however, that work will be accomplished through in-class writing that will allow students to practice the critical thinking skills they need to function in the world. Punctuation and grammar will be reinforced through in-class writing.

Students will also have the opportunity to compose original stories, essays, and poems. Assigned texts will seek to expose students to various writing styles and provide examples of the strategies of other writers. In addition to learning various aspects of authoring, students will learn how to write in different genres.

A capstone project, collaborated on by all students (**with parental/guardian permission**), will result in an actual published compilation book of all approved assigned works.

THE MATH DEPARTMENT

MATH BASICS (8:30-10:00) *WEDNESDAY CLASS ONLY

Grades (*6) 7-8

Math Basics is a **one-day math course** designed for the younger student needing additional instruction with basic math skills before entering Pre-Algebra. In this math course, we will solidify the four basic math skills – addition, subtraction, multiplication, and long division which can be very challenging to younger students. Fractions, conversions, the metric system, Roman numerals, divisibility rules, percentages, decimals, and solving basic word problems will also be covered in this class. Knowledge of these basic skills are needed in Pre-Algebra but are only reviewed due to time restraints. This class bridges that gap. Obtaining a firm foundation as well as mathematical reasoning and test taking skills gives the younger learner added confidence and sets the students up for success in Pre-Algebra.

PREREQUISITE: *All students must complete a non-graded math assessment to show which skills need more emphasis. Depending on the math assessment results, a 6th grader may be accepted for Math Basics. Eighth graders who do not score well on the Pre-Algebra Assessment may be advised to take Math Basics. It is also highly recommended that all students know their multiplication tables from 1 – 12.

NOTE: This class meets on Wednesdays from 8:30 – 10:00am at Lakeview Baptist Church, 9225 Atlanta Hwy., Montgomery. To be successful in this class, faithful weekly attendance is essential.

PRE-ALGEBRA (12:15-1:45)

Generally Grades (7 & 8)

Pre -Algebra is a comprehensive course designed to review important Basic Math Concepts as well as learning Basic Algebra concepts. This class covers Integer rules, square and cubed roots, Order of Operations, geometry basics, solving equations and inequalities, basic graphing, and basic statistics. A strong foundation

of basic math skills is required. All students must know their multiplication tables from 1 – 12. Please note, students will not be allowed the usage of calculators except for the ratios & proportions chapter. I do have a class set of calculators for usage in those lessons. Students must learn to properly analyze and solve problems based on concepts learned. Pre-Algebra is a must in order to have success in Algebra 1. Please note, math builds from year to year. Students who do not grasp their basic math and Pre-Algebra skills may struggle in Algebra 1. This class bridges that gap.

PREREQUISITE: All students must complete a non-graded math assessment. This helps shows me what concepts my students need to review. Depending on the math assessment results, advanced *7th graders may be accepted for Pre-Algebra.

*Pre-Algebra is a two-day class. Mondays we will meet at Vaughn Forrest and Wednesday at Lakeview Baptist Church, 9225 Atlanta Hwy, Montgomery.

ALGEBRA 1 (10:15-11:45)

Generally Grades 8-9

Algebra 1 is a comprehensive Algebra course which meets twice per week and gives students a clear foundation of solving equations, linear functions, graphing, polynomials, and quadratic equations. Algebra 1 is the root of high school math and science. First Semester, we will learn to solve problems using Critical Thinking and application of concepts; therefore, calculators will not be allowed. Second Semester many of the concepts are in more depth; therefore, calculators are needed and help in preparation for Geometry and Algebra 2.

PREREQUISITE: Pre-Algebra is highly recommended to ensure that all students have a clear understanding of basic math which is necessary for success in this course. All new students are required to take a non-graded math assessment for proper placement.

ALGEBRA 2 (10:15-11:45)

Generally Grades 9-12

This comprehensive Algebra 2 course meets twice weekly. This course expounds upon all functions introduced in Algebra 1 and Geometry, such as linear, absolute value, and quadratic functions. We will additionally cover exponential & logarithmic functions, matrices, sequences & series, and trigonometry to prepare students for Pre-Calculus and beyond.

PREREQUISITE: Students should have a thorough understanding of Algebra I (Completed Geometry is **Strongly Recommended** but not necessary). A non-graded math skills assessment may be required if the student had a C or below in their previous math class.

GEOMETRY (8:30-10:00)

Generally Grades 9-11

This class meets twice a week and is a comprehensive geometry course using logic and theorems for problem solving. The course covers parallel lines, triangles, quadrilaterals, polygons, circles, and solid figures, and is designed to assist students in preparation for the ACT. Geometry may be taken before or after Algebra 2.

PREREQUISITE: A solid foundation in Algebra I. A non-graded math skills assessment may be required if the student had a C or below in their previous math class.

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PRE-CALCULUS (12:15-1:45) CLOSED

Generally Grades 10-12

This is a comprehensive pre-calculus course that meets twice weekly. This course expounds upon all functions introduced in Algebra 2, such as piecewise, power, root, rational, exponential, and logarithmic functions. This course also lays a foundation for Calculus by introducing vectors, sequences and series, matrices, and limits.

PREREQUISITE: A solid foundation in Algebra 2. A non-graded math skills assessment may be required if the student had a C or below in their previous math class.

BIOLOGY WITH LAB (10:15-11:45)

Generally Grades 9-12

Class: This course covers a variety of topics such as the chemistry of life, ecology, cells, genetics, and the diversity of all organisms. God created a beautiful, intricate world that students will explore from a Christian worldview. The goal of this course is to give students an understanding of basic biological principles and an appreciation for the interactions and relationships that occur in the world around them.

Lab: The lab component of this course is designed for student engagement through hands-on experiences and demonstrations to solidify conceptual understanding, reinforce ideas, and provide opportunities for enrichment. Students will exercise the use of the scientific method for investigation and discovery and be expected to abide by all lab safety guidelines.

Students are required to complete several dissections including: fungi, flower, earthworm, crayfish, perch, and frog in order to receive credit for this course.

PHYSICAL SCIENCE (8:30-10:00)

Generally Grades 8-9

Class: This course covers a variety of introductory topics in both chemistry and physics from a Christian Worldview. Investigating these concepts will provide students with a foundation for understanding the physical world through exploring God's creation. In the chemistry portion of this course, students will study matter – its forms, its elemental components, and how they react with one another. In the physics portion of the course, students will study the physical laws of the universe, with topics including motion, forces, energy, sound, and light. AMERICAN GOVERNMENT AND ECONOMICS (10:15-11:45)

Grades 10–12 (10th grade by exception. Parental interview requested.)

SUGGESTED PREREQUISITES: American History, English Composition I. The objective for each student is to better comprehend our history as Americans, and the constitutionally prescribed functions of government (federal, state & local) and as a result, become effective citizens who actively participate in their respective communities.

Fall Semester: The American Government portion covers the influences of the Founding Fathers, the uniqueness of our Constitution and Bill of Rights, the three branches of our government, the failed, first attempt at federal government, the two theories of our Constitution, federal vs. states' rights, importance of free and fair elections, and how to participate in government as a responsible citizen. Students will accomplish weekly course objectives through a combination of activities including videos, in-class discussions, in & out of class projects, in & out of class quizzes and tests. Mostly facilitated by a free Hillsdale College Online Course. Hillsdale's free online courses are available to any and all via their continuing education department.

Spring Semester: The Economics portion defines/discusses the concept of free markets, monetary theory, the stock market and its cycles, The Great Depression, The Great Recession (federal debt, inflation, deflation), Hayek and Keynes, IRS (flat tax, fair tax), compares and contrasts Communism, Socialism, Capitalism and the freedoms expressed via ownership of private property. We will view the film series Milton Freeman's *Free to Choose*. Students will accomplish weekly course objectives through a combination of activities including videos, in-class discussions, in & out of class projects, in & out of class quizzes and tests. Mostly facilitated by a Hillsdale College Free Online Course. Each student must enroll in Hillsdale's *Economics 101: The Principles of Free Market Economics* course.
