## CRIMES / INCIDENTS

Crimes recorded between 01/12/2024 and 31/12/2024.

North Queensferry – There were 7 Crimes recorded during this period of which 5 crimes involved the Forth Road Bridge. The remaining 2 crimes relate to a theft and an assault.

Inverkeithing – There were 30 Crimes recorded during this period. Some crimes recorded relate to vandalism, assault and possession of a controlled substance. There were 6 recorded crimes relating to road traffic offences included in this figure.

Dalgety Bay/Hillend – There were 16 Crimes recorded during this period. There were 9 recorded crimes relating to traffic offences with the remaining crimes for theft, assault and threatening or abusive behaviour.

Aberdour – There were 3 Crimes recorded during this period. This includes a traffic offence, theft and minor assault.

### **CALLS TO POLICE**

Dates: 01/12/2024 to 31/12/2024

47 calls relate to North Queensferry however, 21 of these were to the roads network or the FRB. There were numerous concerns for calls to the FRB. This is sadly expected at this time of year.

141 calls relate to the Inverkeithing area.

25 calls relate to the Aberdour area.

66 calls relate to the Dalgety Bay/Hillend area.

## COMMUNITY WARD UPDATE

We hope you all had a Merry Christmas and enjoyed the festive period.

December is traditionally a busy period for Police Scotland which tends to see an increase in demand for Police and other emergency services.

During the month PC Kennedy has been deployed to Edinburgh on numerous occasions due to the increase in tourism over the festive period within the capital.

Whilst on duty PC's Thomson and Kennedy have been patrolling the ward area and monitoring calls received to the area. This includes attending the pier in North Queensferry as a resident has contacted

Police about anti-social behaviour outside her property, engaging with and offering advice to staff at local shops and supermarkets regarding shoplifting and completing license premises checks at numbers establishments in the ward area.

### Community Engagement

Inverkeithing High School reached out and requested community officers to conduct an informal lesson on anti-social behaviour and the impact it has on the community. The school selected a small group of males who were involved in organised fighting on school grounds. Officers touched on previous campaigns such as “One punch, two lives” and the impact their decision have on their future. PC Kennedy and Thomson are keen to work closely with IHS during 2025 and will continue to build on the good relationships they have with senior staff within the school.

### Anti-social behaviour

Officers are aware of several calls in relation to Anti-social behaviour in the ward area at the usual hot spots. This continues to be an area of focus for CPT officers.

We would always encourage parents to engage with their children about what they do with their friends when they are out of the house and dissuade them from engaging in any anti-social behaviour.
