Research articles should be printed on A4 size paper with a margin of 2.54 cm on the top, bottom, left, and right sides. The text should be single-spaced throughout the document, and there is no need to divide the document into columns. The text alignment should be consistent on both the left and right sides. It is prohibited to include page numbers in the article.

If there are more than 5 authors (i.e., 6 or more), cite only the first author followed by a comma and the phrase “and others” (in Thai: “and others”).
