# **Become a Curator**

<u>Task</u>: Curate a museum exhibition expressing Nazi ideological principles which led to the victimization and extermination of European Jews, political opponents, Jehovah's Witnesses, homosexuals, Polish and Soviet civilians, Soviet prisoners of war, Germans with physical and mental disabilities, African Germans and the Roma. This exhibition will focus on the non-Jewish victim groups.

#### **Essential Questions:**

The exhibition should answer the following questions

- How were Hitler and the Nazi party able to execute this plan?
- Why did they target these groups?

### **Procedure:**

- 1. Utilize *Nazi Ideology and the Holocaust* to research your assigned cluster of non-Jewish victims. As a group, read the chapter and determine which particular victim group you would like to focus your exhibition on.
- 2. Create and illustrate a timeline which demonstrates the step by step marginalization of your particular victim group and the escalation of Nazi actions.
- 3. Gather and display 4 pieces of propaganda which best illustrate the Nazi ideological principles that placed this group in this category and that tap into public sentiment toward that group.
- 4. Gather 2 documents which demonstrate the systematic nature of the Nazi strategy that marginalized this group of people.
- 5. Gather 4 archival photographs to provide documented proof of the specific abuse towards your victim group.
- 6. Drawing on our previous lesson on Nazi Ideology, identify and explain the

particular ideology used against your group. (i.e. survival depends upon racial purity, survival depends on seizure of territory or survival depends on nullifying or eliminating anti-social groups who undermine society and the government)

- 7. Provide a works cited page affixed to the back of the display board using MLA format.
- 8. Use a tri-fold display board to display your evidence.
- 9. Prepare for a gallery walk of your exhibition.
