These academically talented students will continue in the competition for over 7,100 National Merit scholarships. To become a Finalist, the Semifinalist and a high school official must submit a detailed scholarship application which includes academic records, participation in school and community activities, demonstrated leadership abilities, employment, and honors and awards received. From over 16,000 Semifinalists, more than 15,000 will advance to the Finalist level, where about 7,250 Merit Scholarship Awards will be awarded.
