This year the seventh and eighth graders got their own personal Chromebook that they can use at school and take home. 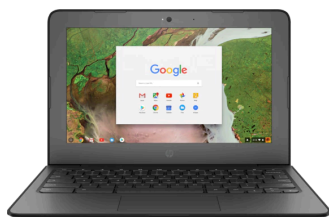
### **4. Do you think students in all grades will get one-to-one Chromebooks next year?**

## **Should PARCC Be Required for Schools?**

According to the website, <https://blog.prepscholar.com/what-is-the-parcc-test>, "State exams are tests that are written and managed at the state level - they're administered, often on a yearly basis, at public schools within that state to monitor student progress. They also set expectations for what students should know at each grade level. Each state that participates in PARCC uses these tests to monitor student progress to make sure that they are learning. These tests are designed to be better replacements for old versions of state tests because (PARCC claims) they provide better info about students skills development to teachers and parents." To help you understand a little better, the website also stated, "In a nutshell, these examinations are meant to evaluate college and career readiness starting at a young age. By evaluating readiness early and often (i.e. on a yearly basis), teachers and parents should be better able to help children prepare for the future. For example, teachers may use information about exam performance to identify where students may need extra help."

Eleven states still take the PARCC. They are Colorado, Washington DC, Illinois, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New Mexico, Rhode Island. There has been rumors that New Jersey

may do away with the PARCC test.

To further explore the topic, I picked one student from each grade level and one teacher to discuss their opinion on PARCC and whether or not students should have to take the assessment. Here's what they all have to say:

*Grade 5:* Naruny Henriquez said yes because he feels that the grades you earn on your PARCC test could get you into a good college.

*Grade 6:* Aiden Sever said, "Yes because kids need to push their limits to know as much as they need to know."

*Grade 7:* Meir Mcnair said, "No because we need to learn our regular stuff that we usually learn."

*Grade 8:* Alexys Diaz said, "No because it wastes our time."

*Teacher:* Ms. Lee said, "I believe PARCC must be required. I do believe that schools, including the teachers and students, need some way to measure learning in a way that is unbiased. The method traditionally is a standardized test. I think that the reason we have relied on and continue to rely on standardized tests is to see that students are actually learning and growing in school. It is hard to do that by just relying on in-class grades and what teachers see. Remember that PARCC is just one small piece of what a student knows and has to offer. I think if we remember that, and don't get

too worried that this test is the only thing that matters (because it's not), it takes a lot of the stress and worry out of it and students can just go in and show what they know!"

Overall, when considering whether the PARCC test should be taken, the fifth and sixth graders said yes and the seventh and eighth graders said no. That's surprising because I assumed all of the students interviewed would have said no. What's not surprising is that Ms. Lee agreed that the PARCC test should be taken, or at least some form of a standardized assessment and that her response was much more thorough than the students' responses. *A Way Out* is a new, puzzle-based video game, and the first game released by Indie developers Hazelight Studios. It was released on Xbox, PS4, and PC (Computer). In its first two weeks, it sold one million copies! It is a multiplayer game and requires puzzle-solving, quick timing, and lots of thinking. The whole plot is two guys trying to escape jail to go beat up another guy for revenge.

Since its a multiplayer game, there's obviously two main characters. The first is Vincent Moretti, who is in jail after being framed for something he didn't do. The next is Leo Caruso, who is in jail for grand theft, or stealing a car. The two meet after the villain of the game, Harvey, sends thugs to eliminate Leo. Vincent sees what's happening and goes full attack mode and takes them down, which Leo is thankful for. The next day during breakfast, the thugs attack again, with Vincent once again stepping in, and the guards take down the thugs. The two men escape during the night, deciding to go and get Harvey. They hunt down one of Harvey's men and interrogate him, learning Harvey is in Mexico. Needing a pilot, they call a friend of Vincent, who is named Emily. Emily quickly reveals that Vincent's wife is going into labor, so him and Leo go to the hospital and meet Vincent's new baby son, whose name is never revealed. They are then forced to flee from the now

oncoming police officers and guards with Emily flying them to Mexico. They arrive at Harvey's mansion, and steal an important jewel from the man that betrayed them both. They barely agree on it, but made a decision that eliminated Harvey's character from existence. Vincent turns out to be a cop, and the game ends with one character eliminating the other character out of the game, as they share one heart-wrenching moment of friendship.

The gameplay is simple. It is split screen and follows the same mechanics as many other games. In some occasions of the game you have a time limit or need to do a chain of events for one important event. The game is impossible to play without two people because it is a multiplayer restricted game, meaning everything in the game requires two people to work together. The controls and mechanics are fun and easy to use, which improves the overall feel of the game.

Overall, the game offers a fun plot with easy and simple gameplay. The system is easy to use, it has a cheap price of \$29.99, and it is available on many consoles. IGN.com gave the game an 8.3/10, Polygon gave it a 7.5/10, and Microsoft Reviews gave it a 4.5/5. Personally, I give the game a 9.2/10, but that's just my opinion. 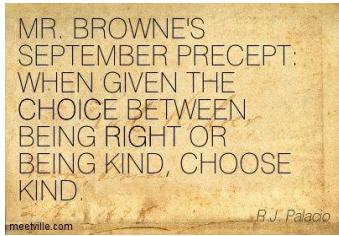

Would you buy any of these products, or would you just ignore them and scroll down?



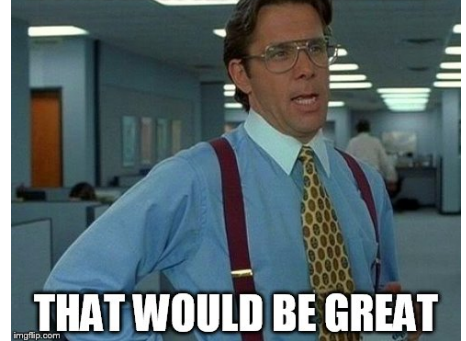
