

Meet the UNCCD COP17 Delegation

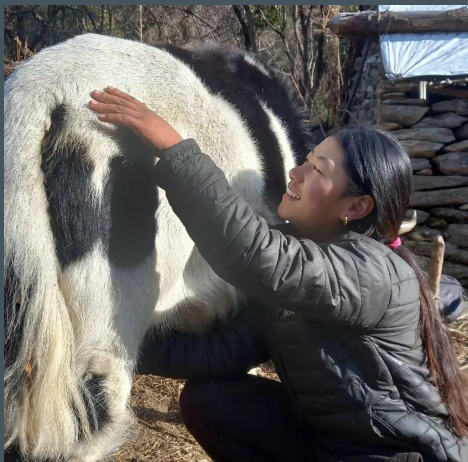


Abarchi Harouna

Organization: ASSOCIATION NODDE NOOTO (A2N); IYRP West and Central Africa

Country / region: Niger; West and Central Africa

Pastoralist leader from Niger and co-chair of the International Year of Rangelands and Pastoralists for West and Central Africa. He brings Indigenous and pastoral community perspectives to COP17, with a focus on rangeland management, soil biodiversity, climate adaptation, land governance, and secure pastoral land tenure.

Country / region: Nepal; Himalayan region

Yak and Chauri herder from Nepal's Himalayan region and Treasurer of the Yak and Chauri Farmers Federation. She represents high-mountain pastoral communities, especially women, whose livelihoods depend on alpine rangelands and who are facing climate change, land degradation, and policy barriers.

CITAFRO leader and President of ODECO, working to advance Afro-descendant territories in global environmental policy. At COP17, she will highlight the impacts of desertification and land degradation on Afro-descendant communities, and advocate for restoration, racial equity, human rights, and environmental justice.

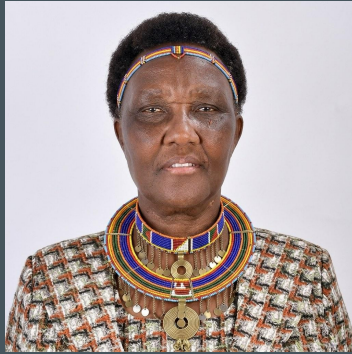
Reagan Siamito

Maasai leader, educator, trainer, and Board Member of ILEPA in Kenya. She represents Maasai pastoralist women affected by rangeland degradation, land fragmentation, and climate change, and brings experience in women's cooperatives, livelihood diversification, education, and economic empowerment.

Country / region: Kenya; northern Kenya drylands

Founder and Executive Director of Pastoralist Goals Foundation, an Indigenous-led organization working on pastoralist rights, community land governance, climate justice, culture and heritage, and youth leadership in Kenya's drylands. At COP17, he will bring northern Kenyan pastoralist youth perspectives into global rangeland discussions.

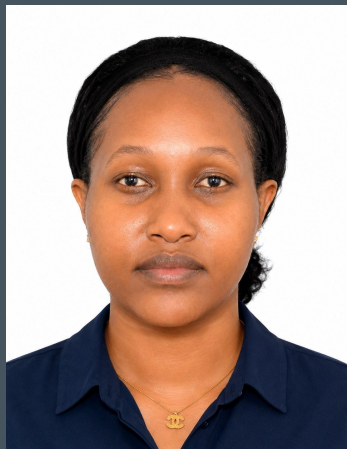


Jacob Lekaitogo

Quechua Indigenous leader and a recognized community member of the Pucayacu Peasant Community, in the district of Yanacancha, province and department of Pasco. He is a breeder of South American camelids and sheep. From a very young age, he has been a member of his community's board of directors and has been repeatedly elected president of the community. He is a member of the governing council of the Andean Indigenous Council of Peru (CIAP), which is part of CAOI. He has actively contributed his traditional knowledge on pasture restoration, reforestation with native species, and water harvesting and conservation to the project "Indigenous Peoples Restoring Andean Ecosystems for Good Living," implemented in the communities of the upper Huallaga River basin.

Sonia Astuhuamán Pardavé ("Pacarina Huanca")

Quechua leader of the Kuntur Wanka Nation. She is a spiritual leader of Indigenous Peoples, a healer, a weaver of collective dreams, and a voice for the communities of the Peruvian Andes on the world stage. She currently serves as Women's Advisor to the Andean Coordinating Body of Indigenous Organizations (CAOI) and the Andean Indigenous Council of Peru (CIAP). She has created healing spaces such as the Circle of Women Healers and the Dance of the Moon, and has participated in numerous international events and conferences on the rights of Indigenous peoples, women, and biodiversity.
