City Updates

- **OCS updates/DCHS updates - Alison**
 - Housing needs
 - Most available funds have been depleted for temporary housing
 - Prioritizing eviction prevention services.
 - Still have availability for emergency support
 - Shelter wait list
 - Very long; individual men (45), individual females, families with children (24 families with children)
 - Halt in rapid rehousing funding → supports individuals in shelter getting out of shelter w/ security deposit, first months rent
 - Carpenters Shelter → Received homeless reduction grant from housing trust fund for rapid rehousing

- Point in Time (PIT)
 - Planned January 25, 2024.
 - Annual, nationwide PIT count; conducted on coldest night of the year
 - City of Alexandria canvasses the city, meet with people experiencing homelessness, ask them questions to obtain information, collect information along with data from shelters.
 - Not able to report numbers at this point; anticipating increase
 - Public release date: May 2024
- 2024 Strategic Plan to end homelessness
 - Finalized in 2023, presented to council January 23.
 - Asking council to support.
- What Works Cities : Silver Certification
 - Awarded by Bloomberg Foundation to CoA
 - Factors: data presentation; using data to support innovative programming
 - A-CORE: 9/11 phone call for behavioral health, pair social work to go with law enforcement response
 - Eviction Prevention programming & Taskforce (AEPP)
- Community Action Agency: Recognized in Richmond during GA session
- PY Entertainment District
 - Passed House, Pending Senate
 - In negotiation in State House; If makes it to Alexandria, EOC will have opportunity to have input on labor, housing, etc.
- Housing Master Plan
 - Expected June 2024
- General Assembly Update
 - Payment plan for all tenants who owe one month or less
 - Requiring summary page on leases in plain language
 - Offering leases in multiple languages (passed House)
 - Increasing pay or quit from 5 to 14 days
 - Fee Transparency
 - Pilot program for access to counsel
- City Budget Process: See powerpoint sent via email
 - Ali described the budget process and upcoming opportunity for EOC to advocate
- Updates from DCHS Boards & Commissions Chairs quarterly meeting:
 - Consideration for youth representation on commissions
 - Collaborating with other boards and commissions

 - Tim shared an update on the needs Assessment
 - Ali said next step is DCHS director review, then sending to the state
 - Jenn suggested a roll-out of some kind for this before June
 - Event, press release, something more than simply presenting to Council and placing in an online file
