Learning Spaces

- Use the same space and set it up the same way every time, if you can't leave it set up permanently.
- Pick a space without distractions (TV off, no toys, etc.)
- Have room to write, draw, use multiple materials.
- Have a seat that will help your student sit up straight. (No couch, beanbag, bed, unless appropriate.)
- Have all materials ready to go each (iPad, pencils, crayons, book, teacher's packet and other special materials)
- If possible, pick a space next to an electrical outlet, so the iPad can stay plugged in. (Charge the iPad each night.)
- Think of your student's personal needs (room to wiggle, no pencil sharpener, how much supervision they need, etc.) Allow them to personalize their space. Hang up artwork and other assignments.
- It's okay to make a mess, but keep the space organized and clean up each day.
- Leave room for growth. Students may be adding to their tools and materials in the coming weeks.

Questions to ask your child(ren)

- What did you work on today?
- Did you learn something new?
- What was something that got you excited today?
- Which apps did you use today?
- Did you do any work with pen and paper?
- Did you do any partner work today?
- Show me your browser history.
- What were your successes?
- What challenged you today?
- Did you get to talk to any of your friends today?
- How are you feeling?



Troubleshooting

- Not Enough Storage
 - Try deleting photos and videos emptying the Deleted Photos folder
 - Students can back photos and videos up in Google Photos/Google Drive
- Can't Connect to Internet
 - Restart iPad
 - Home Internet Login Directions
- Apps Freezing
 - Hard restart iPad by simultaneously holding the Power Button and Home Screen Button for IO seconds
- App Running Slow
 - Double-tap the Home Screen Button and swipe up on other apps to close them.
- Username/Password Doesn't Work
 - Make sure that student is not using a personal account and is using their @myfsd account
 - Check to see if the password is case sensitive and make sure student is using capitals when necessary
 - Make sure the student has the proper username. (Some usernames include "@myfsd.org" and some don't.)
- Make Sure Apps Are Up to Date
 - Let students know, in advance, when you'll be updating, so that they can save work and not be using the app during update.
