

SCHOOL WIDE GRADING PROCEDURES- At Fork Shoals School, we are committed to our students experiencing their greatest success at school. We recognize that in order for this to be accomplished, students, teachers, and parents all play a vital role in continuous student achievement.

An important part of our grading procedures involves the posting of grades. Grades are posted in Power School within ten days of the assessment. All parents can receive access to the Parent Backpack to observe and monitor their child's grades. Please be sure to get the login information from the front office if you do not already have it.

Greenville County Schools has a set "floor" of 50. No grade below 50 will be recorded. If a child receives a grade below 50, then the floor will be posted. We hope that this information provides for you a framework to show our passion for improved student achievement.

HOMEWORK- Students are to read for a minimum of 20 minutes each and every night (Please note that required reading time may change as the year progresses). This is very important to building fluency in their reading. Additional homework to practice skills will be sent home on occasion.

PARENT PARTICIPATION- Throughout the school year there will be a variety of special classroom activities and celebrations. I encourage you to attend these functions when possible and to support them by sending needed supplies or treats. Parents are encouraged to share special skills and talents relating to jobs or hobbies, serve as classroom volunteers, assist with field trips and special activities, and collect materials for classrooms. Parents are also encouraged to become active members of the Parent Teacher Association (PTA).

VOLUNTEERS- I welcome and appreciate any volunteering that you can do for our class and 2nd grade team. My instructional time with your child is extremely important, therefore I ask for your understanding in cooperating with a few important guidelines.

- 1. Please contact me at least 1 day ahead of time if you are coming to help so that I can get materials together. Please give me a quick courtesy call or note if you can't come that day.
- 2. If you are helping with academic activities, please respect the privacy of each student.
- 3. If you plan on being a chaperone for a field trip, you may be asked to drive your own car and siblings are not allowed due to the responsibilities of the chaperones.

Your support of school activities makes your child feel important and sends the message that you value school. I appreciate your support and look forward to working with you. **FIELD TRIPS-** We will have a field trip to Roper Mountain Science Center, Happy Cow Creamery, and the Children's Theater. As we plan additional field trips, we will communicate that information with you.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE/TARDY POLICY- School attendance is very important. Please be sure that your child is at school every day and on time. All absences must have a note either from a parent or a doctor. Three consecutive or five total unexcused absences are considered truant. After ten absences, we must have a doctor's note. Contact will be made once students are truant. Continued truancy could result in an administrative conference and possibly lead to a referral to our district attendance truancy officer. Please view school as a priority and see to it that your child attends every day except in cases of illness or emergency. Likewise, it is important that your child arrive at school on time. Instructional time is severely interrupted and your child feels quite uncomfortable when having to join the class later than everyone else.

SCHOOL HOURS- School begins at 7:45 and ends at 2:15. Please be sure that your child is at school on time. Students will stay in their designated hallway (2nd grade) and be supervised by an adult if they arrive before 7:30. If you will be picking up your child in the afternoons, please come through the car line. Your child's number and name will be posted, and he/she will come to your car. If you need to pick up your child during the school day, you must sign him/her out in the office. One of the secretaries will call your child to come to the office over the intercom. There are no early dismissals after 1:45 PM.

CHANGES IN TRANSPORTATION- If there is a change in your child's transportation you must send a written note. If no written note is received, your child will be sent home by his/her usual method of transportation.

MONEY- Please send all money to school in an envelope or baggie. Please have the following information written on it:

Your child's first and last name.

The amount of money.

The purpose for the money

HEALTH ROOM- Please note that the health room cannot administer any itch relief creams to students. If your child may need a topical cream or other medicine for any reason please write a note, personally bring in the medicine, and deliver it to the nurse in the health room.

Classroom Commitments for Behavior- At Fork Shoals School, we build a school family where safety, connection, and problem-solving are at the heart of learning. As a Conscious Discipline and PBIS school, our shared commitments

reflect our STAR commitments and support the development of social-emotional skills alongside academics.

These commitments guide our actions and help us build a strong, connected school family where everyone can learn and grow.

Celebrating STAR Behavior- We recognize and celebrate students who make helpful choices and live out our school commitments:

- Star Cards are given to students who demonstrate safe, responsible, and respectful behavior.
- Every Star Card is an opportunity to be celebrated:
 - Weekly Drawing: Each Star Card is entered into a weekly drawing.
 Two cards are drawn per grade level are announced on the Fork
 Shoals Morning News, receives a "Shout Out Cheer" at the Bell
 Tower, and a Star Pencil!
 - Classroom Incentives: Students may trade in Star Cards for meaningful rewards.

Big Bright Stars will be reserved for celebrating outstanding work in Related Arts classes.

Responding to Mistaken Behavior- We view behavior as a form of communication and an opportunity to teach missing skills. When students act outside our commitments, we respond with empathy, connection, and consistency.

Guidelines for Responding to Behavior-

- 1st Time: A verbal reminder is given, and the student is re-taught the expected behavior with connection and encouragement.
- If behavior continues: A Classroom Discipline Report (CDR) will be completed. Parents are notified, and a consequence such as:
 - Structured recess time (5 minutes)
 - Silent lunch
 - Temporary removal from group activity will be used to help the student reflect and reset.
 - Other logical consequences
- Three CDRs within 45 days or one severe behavior will result in an office referral for administrative support.
- After two office referrals, a conference with administration, the teacher, and the family will be held to create a support plan.

Classroom Support Tools- To keep our classroom safe and supportive for all, the following tools may also be used:

- Temporary loss of privilege (e.g., seating choice or delayed recess)
- "Bouncing" to another teacher's room to reflect on the behavior
- Parent contact by phone, email, or note
- Student check-in or conference with an administrator
- Referral to administration when needed

These tools are always used in conjunction with teaching and supporting the child in making better choices. The goal is not to punish, but to help the student reconnect, reflect, and return to the group ready to learn.
