Memory verse – can everyone recite the core (memory) verse this week? (Jer.31:33-34)

Starter questions

- 1. What stood out to you as you read about the New Covenant in this lesson?
- 2. Did your understanding of the New Covenant change after reading this chapter? How?

Key Passages to Help Us Understand the Core

- 1. In Matthew 3 and Luke 4, in what ways do you see Jesus establishing a new covenant?
- 2. Luke 22:20; 1 Cor.6:19-20; Heb.9:14-15. What did the Holy Spirit reveal to you as you meditated on these verses this week? Did God challenge you through any of them?

Group Discussion – don't try to do them all Pick the ones best suited to your group

- 1. In the video associated with this question, Mark says that the big questions aren't WHY? Or HOW? But WHO? Try explaining that to others in your group.
- 2. The author states that Jeremiah gives us three ways in which a new covenant will be different and better (pp.109-110). What is so good about each one?
- 3. Share a time in your life when you were in the deepest despair you have experienced (if anyone is there now, have the group stop and pray for them). During that time, what gave you the greatest hope or strength to get through it?
- 4. When you share the Gospel of Jesus with a neighbour or colleague, do you start at the "beginning"? How does revealing why we so desperately need a savior...make the Good News even greater? What hope is given to all who believe repent and are baptized into Christ? Romans 15:13

Application for the Week

- 1. The Day 5 challenge (pp.112) was to read Hebrews and note the advantages of the new covenant. It is recommended to extend this lesson to a 2nd week just to look at Hebrews (see back of this page for a suggested outline for 2nd session).
- 2. How would you sum up what the new covenant means in just a few words?
- 3. **PRAY** ask God to help everyone in the group live out this lesson in their life

NOTE: Second lesson, focusing just on the Book of Hebrews, is on the back page. Have the group read Hebrews 13 prior to next week. Assignment is the Day 5 challenge.
