Authors must follow all writing rules, in terms of font, size, layout, word count, systematics, and references.

The body of the article including bibliography should be written in one column as shown in this template. Articles must be submitted in Microsoft Word, with A4 paper size, 2.54 cm top and left margins, 2.54 cm right and bottom margins, and single spacing between lines. The font used in the body of the article is (Times New Roman, Font Size 12).

The writing of punctuation marks (period, comma, colon, semicolon, parentheses, quotation marks, question marks, exclamation marks, slashes, etc.) is not preceded by a space and continued by a space, except for the use of periods or commas in decimal number markers.

The introduction mainly contains the reasons for conducting the research supported by a literature (theoretical) review. The introduction is expected to contain as many citations as possible from scientific journals (preferably from national journals and reputable international journals).

To facilitate the author, technically the author can use this template in full. The author can adjust the entire content of the writing with this template (overwritten) section by section, so that as a whole it is expected that the submitted article is in accordance with the expected guidelines. RESEARCH METHOD

Each table must be given a table caption and numbered sequentially at the top of the table followed by the table title. Figures must be guaranteed to print clearly (font size, resolution and line size must be guaranteed to print clearly). Figures and tables and diagrams/schematics should be placed in columns between groups of text or, if too large, in the center of the page. Tables should not contain vertical lines, while horizontal lines are allowed but only important ones.
