

Dingles

Dingles is a tennis game with **four players per court** where you combine singles and doubles play:

1. **You and your teammate** start on the same baseline while your opponents will go to the baseline on the other side of the court.
2. With all four players starting on the baseline, **one team** starts **two simultaneous "singles" points** by feeding a ball to the opposite crosscourt.
3. Keep the rally going until one player misses. **When someone misses**, yell out "Dingles!"
4. Now, **the remaining ball** that is still in play **turns into a doubles point** with all four players participating until the rally is over.
5. A point is scored **only if one team wins both rallies**. If each team wins one rally, then it's a tie and no points are scored.
6. Go back to step 1 and start new rallies.
