Value Scale Exercise

Outcomes:

Students will explore relationship of value with and without color Students will mix and construct a progressive achromatic and monochromatic scale Students will learn about shades and tints



Assignment Process:

- 1. Create a 10-step an achromatic value scale by painting black, white, and 8 even steps of gray in between them. Paint areas of approximately 1" x 2" on watercolor paper.
- 2. Cut out each value step, 1"x2" section. Glue the gray chips in a vertical column to the left margin of the paper provided. See diagram below.
- 3. Similarly, create a 10-step monochromatic value scale by painting black, white, and one color of your choice and 8 even steps of gray in between them. Paint areas of approximately 1" x 2" on watercolor paper. Cut out the same size pieces and glue them to the right of the value scale so that the values should somewhat match between the scales.
- 4. Label your work Value Scale.
