We ask advisers and students to plan ahead so participants can **stay for the full day**—this is a once-a-year opportunity for FCCLA members to connect, learn, and lead. Please make arrangements in advance for work, sports, childcare, and other commitments so students can fully benefit from this experience.

This conference is for any FCCLA adviser(s) and chapter officers. The registration cost is \$60.00 Lunch is included in the cost. The deadline for registration is **September 18, 2025.** Remember, before you can register your students need to be affiliated nationally!

- <u>Step 1: AFFILIATION:</u> All students and advisers attending the conference must be affiliated with National FCCLA before registering for the conference. Please read the <u>FCCLA Affiliation Step by Step Instructions</u> before you proceed to affiliate for the first time this year. Attached are the instructions on how to affiliate. Go to the National website (<u>www.fcclainc.org</u>) and click on "Chapter Login". If you affiliated last year you will use the same username and password. **DO NOT HIT FIRST-TIME AFFILIATION.**
- <u>Step 2: CONFERENCE REGISTRATION:</u> Registration will open on September 1st. \$60 per attendee. After you have affiliated your chapter then click on this link <a href="https://www.registermychapter.com/fccla/ut-fall">https://www.registermychapter.com/fccla/ut-fall</a> to register for Fall Leadership. You will be able to print an invoice from the registration site. The Utah FCCLA finance administrator will be receiving all money for the conference. Mail checks to Utah FCCLA c/o Brendan Abbott P.O. - Make checks payable to **Utah FCCLA**. Your payment must be sent to complete your registration on time along with a copy of your invoice. The online registration site will close at midnight on September 18th, and payments must be postmarked that day. There will be no refund after the online registration is completed or after the September 18th due date. The registration letter and other forms are attached and are also available on the <u>Utah FCCLA website</u>. Please make sure that all names are spelled correctly. Name Tags are printed directly from the online registration.
- <u>Step 3: DRESS CODE</u>: Have each student complete a Code of Conduct and Medical Information form for each student. All students must be in FCCLA meeting dress and sign the media release form for this year. All of these forms can be found <u>HERE</u> under "required documents". No jeans for students or advisers, no torn or ripped clothing, black, white and red are the FCCLA required colors.
- **Step 4: HOTEL RESERVATIONS:** Schools that are staying the night before the conference will be responsible for making their own hotel reservations.
- SERVICE PROJECT: Utah FCCLA is proud to support foster youth through a statewide sock drive in partnership with Utah Foster Care and We Help Two. Each year, thousands of children enter foster care in Utah, often with very few personal belongings. Something as simple as a clean pair of socks can provide comfort, warmth, and a sense of dignity.
  Our goal is to sell 2,500 packs of socks—if we reach that goal, 1,250 pairs will be donated to foster children across the state. FCCLA chapters are encouraged to get involved by hosting sock drives, sock hops, "Socktober" events, or other sock-themed fundraisers in their schools and communities.
