

## GOLDA'S BALCONY with Sandra Laub as Golda Meir

Sandra Laub, an award-winning actress and veteran educator, has been performing William Gibson's Tony Award-winning one-woman play, *Golda's Balcony,* in a variety of settings—theaters, classrooms, social halls, sanctuaries, outside under tents and online —to critical acclaim and heartfelt audience response since 2013.

**Golda's Balcony** is a 90-minute tour-de force. With humor, pathos, and passion, we see her journey from impoverished child in Czarist Russia to becoming Israel's 4<sup>th</sup> Prime Minister, scrambling to save the country from impending destruction during the 1973 Yom Kippur War. At the heart of the play is Meir's lifelong struggle to attain peace while agonizing over difficult moral choices, including especially the 'terrible question': *"What happens when idealism becomes power?"* 

The birth of a nation and the pioneering spirit of its founders are embodied in Golda Meir. She was a wife, a mother, a worker, and attained extraordinary stature on the world stage. Golda's struggle to reconcile the competing forces of family versus politics personalizes the taut drama centered on Israel's 'secret' nuclear capability: Golda's view "into hell."

For some audience members, this is a "new" story. After one performance, three generations of one family told how meaningful it was to see the play together: grandparents and parents remembering, grandchild learning -- a story that must be continually told and never forgotten.

I'm writing to share our experience with Sandra Laub's low-key production and high-key performance of Golda's Balcony at our Temple a few weeks ago, and to encourage other temples if they wish to consider arranging a similar event.

This is a moving and educational play, it was beautifully performed, and it was received most enthusiastically by a sold-out audience. We all had tears in our eyes.

The first thing I heard from our chief fundraiser was "This was wonderful. What can we possibly do next year that would be this good?"

Sandra's plan for transforming the Temple into a play-space for one night was simple, and easy to accomplish. It took about 4-5 man-hours to set up seating and simple props, and about 2-3 man-hours to return the Temple to normal the next morning. It took me one learning-session, and one technical rehearsal to be able to work the sound effects, which I found to be a joy and an honor.

The play is beautifully written, with appropriately staged transitions. Sandra did an excellent job of performing these transitions and bringIng Golda to life.

The Emanuel Synagogue sanctuary is a much larger venue than the Contemporary Theater Company and Beth David Synagogue in Rhode Island where I previously saw Sandra perform the play. Yet, the connection to Golda was just as intimate.

Coming down off the stage/bima to walk down the center aisle was very effective, almost startling, certainly surprising. Walking up to specific audience members to address lines directly to them was equally effective.

The audience was completely silent and enthralled during the entire performance. Their loud applause and standing ovation confirmed their great appreciation.

I am amazed by Sandra's transformation to Golda, although their physical sizes and ages are so different.

Thank you to Sandra Laub for her outstanding performance.

#### Testimonial of Sandra Laub's WSTHZ Performance of Golda's Balcony



Sandra Laub has combined theater and teaching for over 25 years. A graduate of Northwestern University and the American Conservatory Theater, she has acted in dozens of professional productions, including musicals, classic and contemporary plays, and premieres of new work. Off-Broadway credits include Circle Rep, WPA, Dance Theater Workshop, Equity Library Theater, Ensemble Studio Theater, La Mama, and Joseph Papp's Shakespeare In the Park (*Richard III* with Kevin Kline), as well as Restoration Comedies and Shakespeare she performed with a company she co-founded in NYC: ClassicWorks. Off-Off Broadway Sandra also starred in her own adaptation of Flaubert's Madame Bovary (Wild *Desires*). Regionally, she appeared at New Jersey Shakespeare Festival, Capitol Rep, Wisdom Bridge (Chicago), Colorado Springs Performing Arts Center and Theater West (Los Angeles), among others. Moving from NYC (where she taught acting at the New School and at various acting studios) to Rhode Island, Sandra became an acting teacher at Brown and at URI. In Rhode Island she performed at Perishable Theater, the Brown Summer Theater Festival, the Sandra-Feinstein Gamm Theater, The Granite Theater, Courthouse for the Arts, The Island Theater Company, which she formed with URI colleagues (*The Seagull, Dear Liar*, Candida, Mrs. Campbell! Mr. Shaw! -her own adaptation of the G.B Shaw-Campbell letters), and at 2<sup>nd</sup> Story Theater, where this production of *Golda's Balcony* originated under the


direction of Bryna Wortman. A reprise performance of *Golda's Balcony* produced at The Contemporary Theater in Wakefield, RI garnered stellar reviews and sold out crowds. Currently living in Connecticut, Laub teaches English, Drama, Speech, and Creative Writing at Chariho Regional High School, where she also coaches the English Speaking Union Shakespeare Club.
