Safe distancing. Follow County safety protocol. No need to remove labels or get out of vehicle. Sharps must be in appropriate sharps containers so our volunteers do not get pricked. Separate sharps from meds. Looking for adult volunteers to assist at the event and medically-trained adults to assist with the medication collection.
