Suggested talking points for emails members of Congress (MoCs) who [signed FY26 Dear Colleague letters](#) (send to the foreign policy aide)

- *Subject line: Thank you for your work on global aid appropriations*
- Thank the representative or senators for signing the list the _____ Dear Colleague letters (list the letters).
 - o Remind them that, despite the threat of deep cuts, they helped protect lifesaving investments for tuberculosis, maternal and child health, nutrition, global education, the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, TB, and Malaria, and Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance.
- Explain why you are about these issues and remind them these investments save lives and make the world safer and healthier.
- Tell them that while more investment is needed going forward, as a grassroots advocate from [City, State], you appreciate their boss standing up for these priorities and listening to their constituents.

Suggested talking points for emails to MOCs who did behind the scenes outreach to committee leadership (send to foreign policy aide)

- *Subject line: Thank you for your leadership on global health*
- Thank them for the role the representative or senator played behind the scenes last year on global health.
- Tell them that in particular, you are thankful they reached out to committee leadership about the importance of funding global health programs.
- Remind them this outreach protected critical investments for tuberculosis, maternal and child health, nutrition, the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria, and Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance,
- Explain why you care about this issue and remind them that this is a remarkable outcome that will make a difference in the lives of millions around the world.
- Tell them that, as a grassroots advocate from [City, State], you appreciate them standing up for these priorities and listening to their constituents.

Suggested talking points for emails to members of Congress who did NOT support our FY26 appropriations asks (send to the foreign policy aide)

- *Subject line: Proud to see strong foreign aid funding bill*
- Let the member of Congress know that you're very proud to see Republicans & Democrats coming together to restore funding for global health and poverty efforts.
- Explain why you care about these issues and remind them these investments save lives and make the world safer and healthier.
- Tell them that more investment is needed going forward, and as a grassroots advocate from [City, State], you want to be in touch again soon about FY2027 priorities.
- Tell them you hope they will join the chorus of bipartisan lawmakers championing these transformational investments.
