Anyhow, let's actually get to the damn thing.


1. HYPERCOSMOLOGY

Hypercosmology, the whole thing that started this. For me, I consider Hypercosmology to be more focused on things beyond a multiverse. Mainly after a multiverse (at least for my interpretation) is an Interversal Sphere. Well, an average cosmological layer tends to be spherical. Not always, but most of the time it is. After that, you could have stuff like a kiloverse, hyperverse, or some other random shit. (weird names, i know!)

However you'd want to describe them, I'd prefer to just go by numbered layers. So a universe would be a Layer 1 verse, a multiverse being a Layer 2 verse, etc. This would be for things beyond an Interversal Sphere. Because yeah, the names can get ridiculous. I may still use the names cause it's somewhat fun, but layer numbers help a bit more at least for me.

It does go both ways. So yes, there's also negative layers. Smaller and shit, how fun.

One way things could be depicted is the diagram below. Yes, it's for something in the future.




There's many ways for something to be well; something. Let's just use a universe as an example for this. You can have organic universes, ones that lead directly into a Layer 4(O) verse (Kiloverse). And it's more "real" in a way. Then you could also have a simulated universe, at some point leading to a Layer 4(S) verse (Metaverse). Is the name even more ridiculous because it sounds like a certain company? Probably. But yea, it could be less "real" as well.

They could even overlap. As the next layer after both a 4(O) and 4(S) lead into a Layer 5 verse (Megaverse). This is one of the main things in Hypercosmology. Containment and Hierarchy. More about hypercosmology will appear throughout this article, because shit comes up in my mind whenever.

1.5. CONTAINMENT & HIERARCHY

Hierarchy is one of the primary things within both Hypercosmology and Beyondology. As it gives layers for what's above and what's below something. Mostly for cosmological things. The basics that one is probably familiar with is a multiverse containing a bunch of universes. Simple stuff, right? Pretty much, but because it's fun;

containment can work in different ways. Here's my dumbass explanation with concepts borrowed from the All Dimensions wiki! (Literally half the things will be from there.)



Containment Type A: The most important one, the only one that matters. Basically the main type of containment I refer to for a layer above another. Layers with this type of containment tend to have a (beyond) infinite amount of the layer below it. (i.e. a multiverse containing an infinite amount of universes within).

Sometimes the amount can vary, because sometimes it could just be one thing. An infinite amount, beyond that, etc. You get the idea.

Containment Type B: The loosest form of containment within. Sometimes there could be layers with lower ones barely sticking to them. Such as a multiverse being almost outside of an interversal sphere.

Containment Type C: Containing some lower layers, but some are outside of it. Despite that, the lower layers tend to stick close to its higher layer, rather than split off entirely into the hypercosmic space beyond.

Containment Type D: Being barely contained or entirely uncontained. A layer with Type D tends to have a significant amount of cosmological influence outside of it. Chances are there's barely any "visible" layer at that point.

Random useless rambling. Time to move onto the next part with more of that!

2. CREATION (woah!)

Creation's a fun subject when it comes to hypercosmology and beyondology. It's also a pretty hard one to explain, so I'll just start from a universe and work from that.

The smallest decision also leads to a massive effect. It's always happening, every fuckin' planck time or whatever the smallest unit of time could be. Say a single grain of sand moves ever so slightly. There's going to be an infinite amount of things that happen. All those create infinite amounts of their own things. 

Department of Beyondology.


