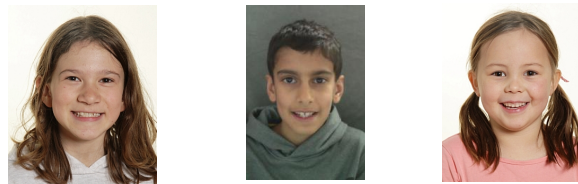
### HAERE MAI - WELCOME...
