What is an Access Code?

Your access code allows you to start your lessons without your Parent present. It also keeps others from accessing your information.

**Your access code/user name is your first name, followed by 2019 without any spaces.**

**For example, if your first name was Michael, your access code and password would be Michael2019.**

**From here, you should see your homescreen and your current lesson.**

**Here's how Failure Free usually works (Source can be found [here](#)):**

### **STEP 1: Scripted Teacher-Led Oral Language Development Lesson**

#### *Direct Instruction:*

I meet with each student/group to preview vocabulary, models reading, teaches comprehension using factual, inferential and leading questions.

- **This can be completed in step 2 as there is a pre-teaching component included.**

### **STEP 2: Talking Software**

#### *Reinforce:*

Students move to the computer for self-paced instruction that provides the structure, privacy and positive and immediate feedback necessary for independent engagement and independence:

(The following are all the components of **EACH** lesson):

- Pre/post tests for each story
- Pre-teaching lesson for each lesson (similar to what is provided in step 1)
- Talking book instruction each lesson
- Word Recognition activity each lesson
- Reinforcement Activities each lesson include spelling practice
- Reading Comprehension Quiz

### **STEP 3: Print Independent Activities**

*Students complete two short pages of reinforcement activities related to the lesson. This is typically completed through their workbooks that they*

*use in school. I can provide you with the pages digitally, but you are also able to discuss them instead.*
