Town Anniversary Community Feedback Summary


During the Clarksburg's 225th Anniversary Event – the MVP Committee and BRPC held a scavenger hunt to gather feedback from attendees. The scavenger hunt started at the Clarksburg MVP Committee tent where committee members and BRPC explained the recently completed planning process and projects that came out, including the redesign and stormwater mitigation at the Town Field and surround area. Participants took a scavenger sheet and visited 6 stations around the Town Field. Stations were at the following locations:


- Booth start location
- Basketball Court/Entrance/Short Walking Path
- Pavilion/Baseball Field
- School nature trail/Emergency Route
- Town Field
- Foot Bridge/Parking Area

A photo of each of the feedback stations can be found at the end of this summary. Participants who completed the scavenger hunt received a prize – blue flag irises. A climate change/nature themed scavenger hunt for kids was available for youth to do alongside the adults. For an example of both sheets see Figure 1. Visitors uninterested in doing the scavenger hunt were engaged in conversation and feedback was recorded on the booth feedback forms.

Most attendees were Clarksburg residents, although a few were from nearby communities in Vermont and North Adams. Below is a summary of the feedback received throughout the day organized by theme.
