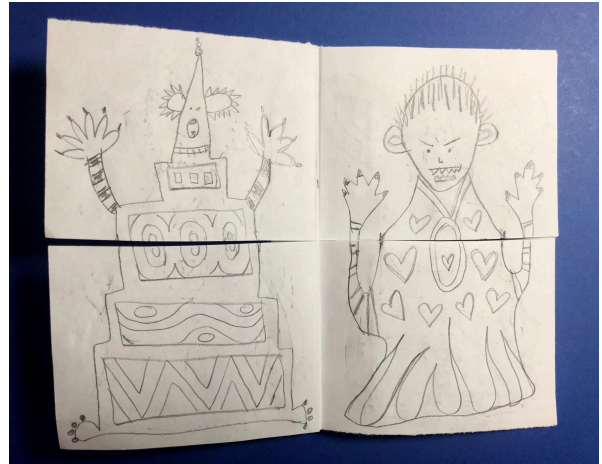
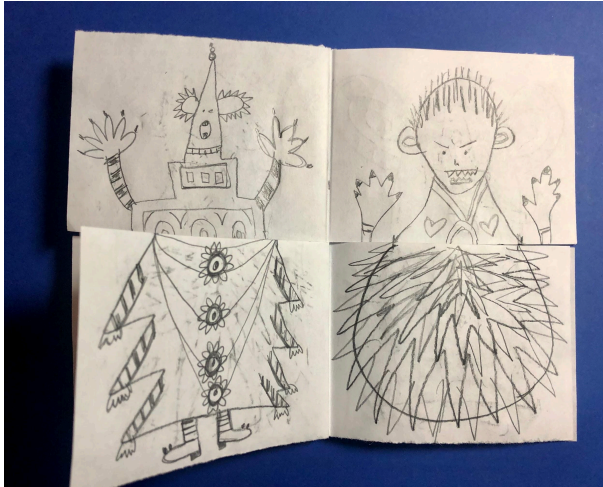


LESSON 1:

How To Make Your Flip Flap Book Video

When drawing your monsters, think about all of the features -

Head: head shape, eyes, nose, mouth, ears, hair, eyebrows, eyelashes

Body: shape of body, clothes, arms, legs, hands, feet

Think about shapes and lines-

Shapes: circle, oval, triangle, square, rectangle, crazy/free form-anything!

Lines: straight, zig-zag, wavy, curly, Anything!

How many?

How big? Or small?

What shape?

Eyes Noses Mouths Ears

Arms Legs Hands Feet????

Is your monster wearing clothes? Jewelry? hat?



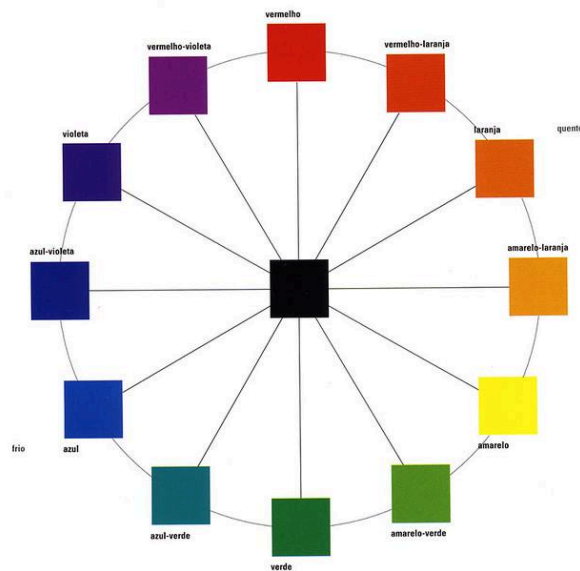

The Found Object Color Wheel CHALLENGE

This is a COLOR WHEEL. This one includes PRIMARY, SECONDARY and TERTIARY colors.



Today you will make a color wheel with found objects. That means you will make it with whatever things you can find (that are ok to use).

Do you like to draw rainbows? You can use Roy G. Biv to help you remember the order of the rainbow. Roy G. Biv is a pretend name. It is an *acronym*.

R- red

O- orange

Y- yellow

G- green

B- blue

I- indigo (blue jean color)

V- violet (purple)

An acronym is when you take the first letter of each word and pronounce it as another word.
