
LESSON 1: Flip-Flap Book





How To Make Your Flip Flap Book Video

When drawing your monsters, think about all of the features -

Head: head shape, eyes, nose, mouth, ears, hair, eyebrows, eyelashes **Body:** shape of body, clothes, arms, legs, hands, feet

Think about shapes and lines-

Shapes: circle, oval, triangle, square, rectangle, crazy/free form-anything! **Lines:** straight, zig-zag, wavy, curly, Anything!



Do you like to draw rainbows? You can use Roy G. Biv to help you remember the order of the rainbow. Roy G. Biv is a pretend name. It is an *acronym*.

R- red

O- orange

Y- yellow

G- green

B- blue

I- indigo (blue jean color)

V- violet (purple)
