Tool Quality: Like weapons, tools are made with various materials. All tools marked “Iron” can be made with alternate materials, according to the following chart:

Tool Descriptions

Adze: A cutting tool used for shaping wood.

Anvil: A heavy block upon which heated metal objects are shaped by hammering. Anvils are never made of bone or wood.

Auger: A wood or bone boring tool with a helical screw blade.

Awl: A tool for making holes and marks in leather, wood, or bone.

Bellows: A device constructed to furnish a strong blast of air. Consisting of a flexible bag between a pair of rigid boards with handles joined by flexible leather sides.

Block and Tackle: A set of pulleys that, when used with rope, allow a character to hoist twice as much weight as a normal single pulley would allow.

Bow Drill: This wooden tool consists of a bearing block, a drill, a hearth, and a simple bow. It is used to drill holes in wood, bone, and sometimes stone.

Branding Iron: A tool used to press a heated shape against an object or livestock with the intention of leaving an identifying mark. Branding irons are not made of wood or bone.

Carding Comb: A device with a toothed cylinder that is hand-cranked to comb wool.

Carpenter's Square: A blade piece of stone, wood, or bone that is cut at a 90 degree angle.

Chisel Set: A set of chisels of varying sizes. Chisels have a sharp cutting edge that is used to shape materials. You must have chisels of the same, or better, material in order to shape it.

Clamp: A fastening device used to secure objects tightly together to prevent movement or separation.

Climbing Boots: Climbing boots adds 3% to Climb Walls checks.

Climbing Gloves: Climbing gloves adds 2% to Climb Walls checks.

Climbing Harness: A leather harness that, when combined with ropes and pitons, prevents a climber from falling when a Climb Walls roll is failed.

Crowbar: A straight bar, with the working end shaped like a chisel and often slightly bent and forked, used as a lever. Crow bars are never made of bone or stone.

Disguise Kit: A package of make-ups, hair dyes, false beards, and various styles of garments. Users gain a +3 to all Disguise proficiency rolls.

Drill: A hand cranked device that rotates a drill bit. Used to bore holes in various materials. Drills are never made of stone.

Drill Bits: Grooved and sharpened metal rods that are rotated to bore into various materials. Drill bits are never made of bone or wood. Drill bits must be of the same quality, or better, material in order to bore into a material.

File: A tool with cutting ridges for forming or smoothing surfaces. Files must be of the same quality, or better, material in order to bore into a material.

Flail, Grain: Two large sticks joined together by a length of rope. Used to thresh grain. A grain flail is always made of bone or wood.

Grindstone: A stone wheel that is spun in order to grind a sharp edge.

Hammer: A hand tool consisting of a solid headset crosswise on a handle and used for pounding.

Hatchet: A one handed, short-handled axe. Unlike a hand axe, a hatchet is not made to be used as a weapon and receive a -1 damage penalty.

Hoe: A versatile agricultural tool used to shape soil, remove weeds, clear soil, and harvest root crops.

Locksmith Tools: These tools are required from the construction and repair to locks and keys. Locksmith tools are never made of bone or stone. Locksmith Tools must be of the same quality, or better, material in order to craft or repair a lock or key.

Loom: A wood or bone machine that aids in weaving fabric. Small looms are able to be carried and can weave to a maximum size of 2' x 5'. Medium looms are able to be carried by a wagon and can weave to a maximum size of 5' x 12'. Large looms are unable to be carried and can weave to a maximum size of 10' x 25'.

Molds: These hollow ceramic blocks come in various shapes and sizes. Molds are used to cast ceramic, glass, or metal.

Nails: A pin-shaped object that is used as a fastener with a flat end and a pointed end. Nails are generally not made of stone or bone. Wood nails are called pegs or treenails.

Paint: A liquid mixture used as a decorative or protective coating. Common colors include: yellow, orange, brown, red, black. Uncommon colors include: white, green, vermilion. Rare colors include: blue, pink, cinnabar. Exotic colors include: Purple.

Pickaxe: A heavy tool with a bone or wood handle; one end of the head is pointed, the other is chiseled.

Pitchfork: An agricultural tool with a long handle and tines used to lift and pitch or throw loose material.

Piton: A spike with an eye through which a rope may be passed.

Planer: A tool used to remove the rough or excess surface from a wood or bone.

Pliers: A tool used to hold objects firmly.

Plow: An implement used to cut, lift, and turn over soil.

Plow Blade: A blade used to cut soil and used in conjunction with a plow.

Potter's Wheel: A machine used in the shaping and decoration of round ceramic ware.

Pulley: A grooved disk that allows a routed rope to change from pushing to pulling. It may also increase the applied force, if used properly.

Rake: A tool equipped with projecting prongs to gather loose material or for loosening the surface of the ground.

Saw: A tool consisting of a tough blade with a hard toothed edge. It is used to cut through bone and wood.

Shepherd's Crook: A long and sturdy stick with a hook at one end, used by a shepherd to manage sheep and other livestock.

Sledge: A heavy wood or stone mallet fastened to the end of a wood handle.

Spade or Shovel: A tool with a scoop on one end, fastened to the end of a long wooden handle.

Spindle: A wooden device used to spin wool into thread. Users add +1 to Weaving rolls when spinning thread.

Spinning Wheel: A wooden device used to spin wool into thread. Users add +2 to Weaving rolls when spinning thread and the time to spin wool is reduced by half.

Tongs: A tool used to grip and lift objects, instead of holding them with the hands.

Trowel: A tool used for digging, applying, smoothing, or moving small amounts of particulate material.

Wedge: A triangular shaped tool used to split wood or rocks. Wedges must be of the same quality, or better, material in order to split a material. Wedges may also be used to hold a door open or closed.

Wheelbarrow: A small wooden single-wheeled vehicle that is used for carrying small loads and is fitted with handles at the rear by which it can be pushed and guided.

Whetstone: A rough stone used to sharpen the edges of bladed tools and weapons.

Windlass: A lifting machine consisting of a horizontal cylinder turned by a crank, so that a line attached to the load is wound around the cylinder.

Wire: Flexible metal thread. Wire must be crafted from metal.

Thieves Tools Descriptions

Acid: A liquid with a pH balance of less than seven. This acid is strong enough to eat through iron. Items that are touched by this acid must make a saving throw vs acid to resist. Acid may be used as a grenade type missile.

Agafari Strips: These thin wood strips are used by sliding them between a door and frame to raise latches on the other side. Bars are too difficult to lift with agafari strip.

Blade, Hidden: These dagger sized blades are designed to be hidden in a common item of large enough size to contain it. It also contains a deployment mechanism, usually a spring to release and lock the blade.

Boots, Hollow: These boots are designed with a hollow compartment in the sole. The compartment is very small, being able to hold about four coin-sized objects.

Clothing, Camouflage: Camouflage clothing comes in a variety of styles and grants a +5% bonus to Hide in Shadows tests, when in the terrain the camouflage is designed for. Terrain choices include forest, mountains, salt flats, sandy wastes, scrub plains, stony barrens and rocky badlands. There is no city camouflage.

Faceblack: A dark paste used to hide exposed flesh. Faceblack grant a +5% bonus to Hide in Shadows tests.

Footpads: Soft coverings for boots or shoes that muffle the sound of foot falls. Footpads grant a +5% bonus to Move Silently tests. However, it is impossible to run with footpads and Climb Walls tests are reduced by 5%.

Hooked Pole: A specialized ten foot pole with a strong bone or wood hook at the end.

Key Making Set: This set allows a user to make a copy of a key from a wax impression or a key in the users possession.

Lockpick Set: A set of tools designed to be used to defeat a locking mechanism. Lockpicks have bonuses and penalties for quality based upon the following chart:

Thieves' Tools: This tool kit includes two vials of acid, agafari strips, footpads, a lockpick set, a wax block, and weapon black.

Wax Block: A block of wax. It can be used to make impressions of keys, signets, or to plug the ears.

Weapon Black: A dark paste used to cover reflective objects, such as obsidian, bone, or metal. When using weapon black, there are no penalties for Hide in Shadows checks if used on an exposed light reflecting object.

Grooming Descriptions

Brush, Cleaning: A hard bristled brush made to clean off the skin and hair. This is how most Athasians clean themselves.

Brush, Grooming: This soft bristled brush is made to style and untangle hair.

Comb: A toothed device used for styling, cleaning and managing hair.

Hair Dye: Pigments used to permanently change the color of one's hair. Common colors include: yellow, orange, brown, red, black. Uncommon colors include: white, green, vermillion. Rare colors include: blue, pink, cinnabar. Exotic colors include: Purple.

Make up: Pigments used to temporarily change the color of one's skin, usually on the face. Common colors include: yellow, orange, brown, red, black. Uncommon colors include: white, green, vermillion. Rare colors include: blue, pink, cinnabar. Exotic colors include: Purple.

Oil, Cleaning: The most popular way for the wealthy to get clean in Balic, cleaning oil is poured over the body and then scrapped off, taking dirt and grime with it.

Perfume: A mixture of fragrant oils or aroma compounds in a liquid form. Perfume is sold in vials of half a fluid ounce.

Soap: Soap is made from yucca and other plants.

Soap: Scented: Scented soap is soap with perfumes added to make the user smell better.

Traveling Tools Descriptions

Bedroll: A portable bedding pad used especially by people who sleep outdoors.

Blanket: A large piece of woven material used as a covering for warmth.

Camp Bed: A narrow, light bed stretched over a folding frame.

Hammock: A swinging bed made of netting or canvas and slung by cords from supports at each end.

Insect Netting: A tight weave net that forms an impassable barrier against tiny and smaller insects.

Sleeping Furs: Furred animal skins that may be used as a blanket or bedroll.

Tent: A portable shelter stretched over a supporting framework of poles with ropes and pegs. Small tents sleep two medium sized individuals. Medium tents sleep four medium sized individuals. Large tents sleep eight medium sized individuals. Pavilions sleep twelve medium-sized individuals.

Cooking and Eating Tool Descriptions

Bolting Cloth: A firm fabric woven in various mesh sizes for bolting flour.

Bowl: A hemispherical vessel, wider than it is deep, used for holding food or fluids.

Cauldron: A large pot used for boiling liquid. Cauldrons are never made of bone or wood.

Fork: A utensil with two or more prongs, used for eating or serving food.

Gallipot: A small ceramic bowl used by apothecaries for preparing medicines.

Kettle: A pot with a lid, used for boiling or stewing. Kettles are never made of bone or wood.

Knife: A cutting instrument consisting of a sharp blade attached to a handle.

Ladle: A long-handled spoon with a deep bowl for serving liquids.

Larding Needle: A large bone needle used to insert strings of lard into lean meat to improve flavor.

Mortar and Pestle: A mortar and pestle is used to prepare substances by crushing and grinding them into a fine paste or powder. They are almost always made of stone.

Pan: A shallow, wide, open container, without a lid, used for cooking. Pans are never made of wood or bone.

Pipkin: A small ceramic pot with a horizontal handle. Add one bit if a lid is desired for the pipkin.

Platter: A large shallow dish or plate, used especially for serving food.

Porringer: A shallow cup or bowl with a handle.

Pot: A round, fairly deep cooking vessel with a handle and a lid.

Pot Hanger: A rack for hanging unused pots.

Quern: A hand mill, used for grinding grain.

Salt Cellar: A specialized bowl for holding and dispensing salt.

Sifter: A woven tool for separating and retaining wanted parts of a material based upon particle size.

Spit: A rotating device used for cooking by roasting over an open fire.

Spoon: An eating or cooking implement consisting of a small shallow bowl with a relatively long handle.

Tightskin: Tightly stretched skin used to cover jars and bowls to protect the contents inside of them.

Tripod: A tripod is a portable three-legged frame used to hang a kettle over a fire.
