Course Description

Advanced Video/Film is an Envision Cinema class that provides students with hands-on experiences in video production. This course is designed for students who have completed the introductory Video/Film course and have an interest in the television, video, film, or other communication professions. Students in the class work together as a real-world production studio to film and edit video content largely geared toward, but not limited to, our weekly campus broadcast, CCA-TV, which covers various community activities and stories. As an SDUHSD Career Technical Education (CTE) course, Advanced Video/Film prepares students with skills that translate directly to future working opportunities in the film industry and for further study at the college level.

Grading

Grades will be determined based on student participation and completion of regular projects throughout the semester, evaluated under the following categories: Pre-Production (preliminary project planning), Production (filming in the classroom studio and in the field), Post-Production (editing using classroom provided software), and Professionalism (responsibility and meeting course expectations).

Students can earn college credit in Advanced Video Film through articulation (credit by exam) with Palomar College's DBA 120. This is a 3-unit course and the description and information are below:

The course introduces theory, terminology, practices, and aesthetic considerations of visual and sound productions in a multi-camera television studio and control room. Topics include studio signal flow, directing, theory and operation of camera and audio equipment, switcher operation, fundamentals of lighting, graphics, video control and video recording and real-time video production.
