

Kenosha Unified Athletics – Hall of Fame Inductee – Class of 2015

Lauren Fennema – 2003

Lauren Fennema, a 2003 Tremper graduate, made a name for herself and her teammates in both soccer and swimming. With Lauren as the standout midfielder for the Tremper Trojans, the team had an overall record 88-12-8, won four consecutive conference championships and advanced to the state final eight three times leading up to a final four appearance in her final year of high school. A four-year varsity letter winner and named All-SEC in 2002, she captained the girls' team for two years. Fun fact: Lauren was the first Kenosha player to score a goal at the state competition.

Swimming in the 200 individual medley and the 100 fly and as a key member of Tremper's 200 medley and 200 free relays, captain Lauren led the Trojans to a 36-0 conference record, four conference championships and four sectional championships. Lauren was a four-year state qualifier, placed in the top 16 in every year, lettered all four years in high school and earned Academic All-State swimming recognition as a sophomore and junior.

Academically, Lauren also ranked at the top during her high school career. She was valedictorian of her class, a member of the National Honor Society, Student Government treasurer, Holy Rosary Athlete of the Year and received the DePaul University Presidential Scholarship that provided her four years of top-notch post-secondary education. Graduating with
