

Raakh Review: Ali Fazal and Sonali Bendre Shine in a Haunting Crime Thriller Inspired by a Dark Chapter of Delhi's Past

The latest crime drama on Prime Video's *Raakh* has arrived with strong critical attention, earning praise for its atmospheric storytelling, powerful performances, and gripping recreation of late -1970s Delhi. Loosely inspired by the infamous Ranga-Bill case, the series explores a chilling investigation which follows the abduction and murder of two teenagers, a crime which sends shockwaves through the whole nation and leaves families searching for justice.

The eight-episode series stars Ali Fazal as Sub-Inspector Jayprakash, a determined young cop leading the hunt for the killers. Alongside him, Sonali Bendre and Aamir Bashir deliver emotionally charged performances as grieving parents struggling to cope with an unimaginable tragedy. Critics have highlighted the ability of the cast to bring depth and authenticity to a story rooted in loss and trauma.

This kind of approach adds psychological depth and sets *Raakh* apart from conventional police procedurals

While not every critic considers it a masterpiece, the consensus is that the series is a compelling watch for fans of crime dramas and true-crime-inspired thrillers.
