[Dr. Colleen Caron](#) holds a Ph.D. in Public Health, Epidemiology. She is the Director of Rhode Island Department of Children, Youth and Families Division of Performance Improvement and Data Analytics and Evaluation unit and is an Assistant Professor of Practice Epidemiology in the School of Public Health at Brown University. In her RI DCYF role, she designs and conducts research, program evaluation and data analysis for system-wide strategic planning and to inform child, family, community and system outcomes. She oversees a diverse staff of epidemiologists\researchers, change management specialists, workforce development and qualitative case reviewers across 4 units within the division. In her academic role she has overseen University-based research projects and program evaluation on multi-site community health intervention programs. Her research focus involves multilevel analysis on the social determinants of health, systemic racism, and ethnic and racial disparity impacting child\family\community welfare, behavioral health and juvenile justice outcomes. She employs a public health framework in her child welfare research, program planning and evaluation.
