III. English Language Arts Adoption (K-8)

Update: Our middle school committee has selected 2 publishers to present their programs: My Perspectives (Savvas) and Amplify ELA (Amplify). Savvas presented last Tuesday and Amplify is presenting October 20th. Our elementary committee scored the three publishers we ordered samples from, but really liked the middle school Amplify curriculum. We ordered Amplify samples and once they arrive, the elementary team will decide on their top publishers they would like to have present.

IV. Shots for Shoes

The Socorro County Department of Health partnered with Western Sky Community Care and SCSD to put on the Shots for Shoes event last week at the high school and middle school. Students were offered the opportunity to get vaccinated at school, with parent/guardian permission. When they got their first shot last week, they filled out a form about their shoe preference. When the students get their second shot in November, they will receive the shoes they requested. There were two students who participated from the high school and one from the middle school.

V. Flu Shots

The Department of Health will be administering flu shots at school to any students whose parents/guardians request it and complete a consent form. Forms will be available November 1^{st} , and the flu shots will be given on November 9^{th} or 16^{th} (waiting for confirmation).

VI. Nusenda Donation

VII. NM Tech Performing Arts Series Youth Concerts & National Dance Institute (NDI) Last week our students began attending the performances at Macey Center. There are a variety of

performances scheduled for this year, including El Guayabo/The Guava Tree, Catpult (Shadow Dance), Creole4Kidz, Mariachi Christmas, Jungle Book, and many others. The performances extend through April of next year.
