Each group member will be responsible for *Making and Explaining* a section of your "report" which will be on the slideshow.

Each individual person will be graded on their "part" of the presentation.

The different sections include:

Introduction:

- -What was your group's comparative question?
- -Reasoning behind the question? What observations were made that led you to develop this question?
- -What did you predict/expect to find?
