Motion 1: Joint College sustainability officer

This JCR notes:

- The UK government declared a climate emergency in May 2019 and committed to reaching net zero by 2050.
- The central University has committed to reaching net zero carbon emissions and net gain in biodiversity by 2035. This commitment was made in the University's Environmental Sustainability Strategy launched earlier this year.
- This strategy was formulated using the resources the central University has access to including the
 Environmental Sustainability team (which contains sustainability, energy, travel, and biodiversity
 experts) and the expertise of several researchers at the University.
- The colleges current sustainability vision is based on the central University Environmental Sustainability Strategy. However, the college does not have access to the same planning and strategic resources.
- There is a need for more expertise in the area of sustainability in the college.

This JCR believes:

- The college as a benefactor of historic emissions has a responsibility to reduce its carbon emissions to net zero as fast as feasibly possible.
- All of the colleges at the University of Oxford would benefit from the specialized strategic help from a sustainability consultant based in the central University Environmental and Sustainability team.
- All colleges including Exeter should contribute to the salary of a member of staff based in the Environmental Sustainability team that is dedicated to assisting colleges to develop planning, strategy, tracking and accounting of college net zero emission goals. (This should, however, not take away from the college's need to integrate sustainability considerations into its own governance).

This JCR therefore resolves to:

- Support the hiring of a sustainability specialist or specialists within the University's Environmental and Sustainability team that specialises in assisting colleges to meet their sustainability goals.
- Support the partial funding of this position by Exeter college and other colleges.

Motion 3: One-time payment of £50 to support student production of Mojo by Jez Butterworth

This JCR notes:

- Mojo is a 1995 play by Jez Butterworth. Set in a seedy Soho nightclub in 1958, Mojo follows
 its eclectic quasi-gangster employees' descent into paranoia and anarchy after they discover
 the club's owner cut in half. With the threat of a rival gang attack looming, and their resident
 musician missing, presumed dead, carnage descends over the course of a summer
 afternoon. Mojo will be performed in TTW3 at the Michael Pilch Studio and produced by
 Nocturne Productions.
- Lucas Ipkendanz, a member of the JCR is part of the production in the role of assistant director and lighting designer.
- The current budget has a predicted breakeven of 37%, with only 33 ticket sales required across the four performances at a venue that can hold 80 audience members. Any profit taken from Mojo can be used for Nocturne Productions to fund other, larger theatrical and film projects, contributing to the ongoing art and culture scene at Oxford.
- It is important to support student participation in drama after an extended period of restricted artistic and theatrical projects during the pandemic. Exeter supporting Mojo in this way, would be an excellent opportunity for the JCR to encourage the extra-curricular involvement of its members and help provide entertainment for members of the university and beyond.
