Course Description and Objectives:

<u>Description</u>: In this course, students will explore characters and situations through their creative resources using theatre games and extended improvisational situations and prepared scripts. They begin to understand the proper use of voice and diction. This course includes an overview of the historical development of the actor's art.

COMMUNICATION

★ Develop physical, vocal, and performance skills that foster an ability to clearly communicate ideas, thoughts and feelings.

ANALYSIS

★ Analyze texts and performances in terms of theme, characters, conflict, settings, events and their interrelationships for effects on costume and makeup.

AESTHETICS

★ Understand and use the design components of theatre.

CULTURE

- ★ Analyze theatre in terms of the social, historical, and cultural contexts in which it was created
- ★ Understand the traditions, roles, and conventions of theatre as an art form.

Classroom Expectations:

Attendance: In this class you will be working closely with other designers in our classroom ensemble. You are expected to show up on time and attend class each day. Students who repeatedly arrive late, leave early, and/or miss class do not have the opportunity for adequate preparation, which can have negative impacts on their work and the work of others. Plan to be early — remember the Stage Manager's mantra: to be early is to be on time, to be on time is to be late!

Description:

★ A total of 3 unexcused tardies leads to a TalkingPoints message home and write-up.

Dress: Students should dress comfortably and appropriately for working in class. Students are required to wear clothes and shoes that you are comfortable moving around in and don't mind getting slightly dirty due to the demands of technical theatre. Students are encouraged to bring a change of clothes/shoes if needed. There will be a designated area for students to leave changes of clothing they need for class in Ms. Kaczmarek's room.

Food/Drink: No food or drink (except bottled water) is permitted in Ms. Kaczmarek's room or the auditorium. Please bring water in a sealed container. Hydration is encouraged!!

Technology Policy: Students should bring their Chromebook to class everyday. During the school day, students must follow the LMMS electronic policy. Phones, smart watches, headphones, and other devices must be in the students backpack from 7:05 am to 2:15 pm. If visible in any way, the student will receive one warning before a device is confiscated by the teacher and turned into the main office.

Respect: I hold you responsible for respecting the rights, dignity, worth, spirit, and freedom of each member of our classroom ensemble. Discriminatory speech or conduct will not be tolerated. The behavior of our designers reflects not only on our class but also on the Ligon Arts program and the school as a whole.

Communication: Communication from Ms. Kaczmarek will take place through Talking Points. *I will always be available for any questions through Talking Points or email on school days - Monday through Friday from 7:30-3:30pm*.

★ Students are expected to reach out to Ms. Kaczmarek in conversation or through email about any absences they may have such as illness, injury, or medical appointments to practice both designer etiquette and clear communication. Parents, of course, may also reach out, but as designers we must communicate clearly.

In-Class Materials: In this course students will be working with various costume materials such as sewing needles, thread, and fabric. Hand sewing materials will be provided by the school. To support students in makeup design, I require that each student orders Ben Nye's Personal Student Theatrical Creme Kit in their specific skin tone. I also recommend that they purchase a makeup primer to help protect their skin. The stage makeup kit is available to order on Amazon, but it is at its most affordable price from:

Ligon GT Magnet Middle School Grading Policy:

Each assignment will be graded out of total points and then translated to its corresponding percentage. For example, if a student receives 10 out of 10 points, they will receive a 100% on the assignment. If a student receives a 9 out of 10 points they will receive a 90% and so on. These grades will then be put into their specific Ligon GT Magnet Middle School policy assignment weight categories.

Assignment Grading Weights:

Product (Major): 40% (Performances, Projects, Project/Performance Etiquette)

Process (Minor): 50% (Mini-Projects, Self-Reflections, Quizzes, Warm-Up Participation, Journals, Rehearsal Etiquette Reports, etc.)

Practice (Homework/Small Assignments): 10% (Classwork like Forms, Small Group Work)
