British Literature 2018-2019

This course will provide a survey of English writings from the Anglo-Saxon period to the modern writers, and readings necessary to grasp British Literature. You will also study the historical context, biographical details, and the major themes of the writings. You will be challenged to apply the ideas presented in literature to your own perspectives on life and to reflect upon how these ideas might impact your own way of thinking.

We will be using the literature to reach the various literary elements that are fundamental to an understanding of literature. Elements such as: character, setting, tone, attitude, etc. The start of our year will focus on these elements.

2 Things You Wanna Know

1. You will be graded as such:

Homework = 40% Tests/Quizzes/Papers = 40% Class Participation = 10% Vocabulary = 10%

2. We will take a quiz every week. Wednesday/Thursday = quiz day. Sometimes it will be multiple choice over our readings (occasionally easy, occasionally AP multiple choice). Sometimes written, just depends. The quizzes will be over the week's readings.

- 1. Be on time and be prepared. This is to say that you know what books you need and you have them.
- 2. Sit in a desk
- 3. Think. Your personhood makes you capable of ordering and refining thoughts. Be a person when you are in this classroom.
- 4. Respect yourself, your classmates, your classroom, and your teacher.
