Welcome back, students and families of the Class of 2024!

I hope your summer has been enjoyable and restorative. Here at WHS, we are busy and excited preparing for the 2021-22 school year. The following information should be helpful as you think about the year ahead:

Student Schedules

Students and families will receive an email at the end of the week directing you to log into the Aspen portal to see their schedule for the year. You may want to take time between now and then to <u>log in to Aspen</u> so you don't encounter any delays when you are seeking schedule information later this week. Building Tours: August 24th, 10:00 am-1:00 pm

On August 24th, new and returning students will have the opportunity to walk through their schedules and identify their classroom locations prior to the first day of school. Senior NHS volunteers will be stationed throughout the building to guide student walk-throughs. Structured building tours for new students will also be offered during this time.

Please note: this is students' **only** opportunity to walk-through their schedules; the first day of school this year will follow the traditional Day 1 schedule for all students. **Advanced sign-up to attend on 8/24/21 is strongly recommended**; click here for **High School Tour Sign-Ups**.

 you with additional resources and fee waivers.
