#Comments4Asylum Interfaith Toolkit

Background: After years of chipping away at the asylum system and the rights of those in need of protection, the Trump administration is <u>proposing</u> a rule that would effectively end asylum once and for all. This is a crisis moment and historic low point with literal life or death consequences for some of the most vulnerable people in the world.

In the proposed rule, the administration would allow judges to decide cases before people have had the chance to present their full case in court and deny asylum for reasons that have nothing to do with the need for protection. It raises the standards for the initial border interview impossibly high and gives adjudicators discretion to deny asylum applications on legal grounds that federal courts are currently reviewing and are not yet final. It also ends asylum for those fleeing violence from intimate partners and family members, gangs and other non-state actors. Instead of the typical 60-day comment period, the administration is only allowing 30 days, seeking to execute its cruel and deadly plan as quickly as possible.

Interfaith teachings recognize the dignity and sanctity of every human being. This rule would discard those who need hospitality and protection the most.

This is a moment of crisis and calling for people of faith. Asylum seekers need you to raise your voice now.

3. Write a personalized letter:

Send a handwritten letter to the administration about why the U.S. must protect asylum seekers. Use your own experiences, stories, perspectives, values and research. See resources at the end of the toolkit.

Handwritten letters and other unique comments are key to helping slow down this cruel plan. *Note:* you can comment online AND send a letter, there is no limit.
