Mississinewa eLearning Day 2020-2021 Session Descriptions

Concurrent Sessions 1: 10:00-10:50 You will choose one session to attend, but all sessions will be recorded for viewing later!

<u>How to Use Boom Card and Slides [K-1]</u>: Want a fun and interactive way to assess students? Boom Cards and Google Slides are for you! We will be going over the basics of using Boom Cards and Google Slides in a K-1 classroom.

Running a 'Successful' Indian Success Hour [6-12]: Have you wondered how to make 90 minutes of "unstructured" time beneficial both socially, emotionally and academically for your students? It's more than a glorified study hall with weekly Guidance lessons! Come and take part in a time of idea sharing where you will learn what you can do to make ISH a block that both you and your students look forward to and grow during.

<u>Virtual Communication 101 - The good, the bad, the ugly [secondary]</u>: Come join the discussion on lessons learned while communicating with students and parents. Discover "what works" and explore ideas with your colleagues.

<u>Virtual Learning Troubleshooting Techniques:</u> This session will review how to fix many of the problems your students/parents will face when completing virtual learning activities. Interactive Digital Notebooks: Have you heard of interactive and digital notebooks but aren't sure how to use them or even how to create one? Would you simply like to have some resources to get your feet wet? This session will demonstrate how you can incorporate these notebooks in elementary and secondary classrooms, give you some resources to get you started, and allow you the opportunity to work on one for your class(es)

Google Classroom and Meet for Beginners [K-1] (iPad focused): This session is for teachers who are using Google Classroom for the first time this school year. Learn all the in and outs, as well as tips and tricks for using this powerful classroom management system. You will also learn about Google Meet and how to set up a meeting.

<u>Exceptional Ed. in a Virtual World:</u> In this session, participants will discuss accommodations and practical ideas for meeting virtual student needs with an expert from the **PATINs project.**

Round Table for Virtual Student Success: Join your peers to share & learn ideas and strategies that may inspire Virtual Students to engage and succeed in reaching their academic goals.

Concurrent Sessions 2: 12:00-12:50 You will choose one session to attend, but all sessions will be recorded for viewing later!

<u>Advanced Google Classroom and Forms [K-1]:</u> You've set up your Google Classroom and created an assignment, now what? Having trouble adding attachments? Not sure how to organize your assignments? Want to know more about grading? This is the session for you! We will be focusing on using Google Classroom and forms on an iPad.

<u>Study Island Q&A:</u> Study Island is an assessment and skill practice tool similar to IXL. Attendees will explore the basics from a Study Island expert (**Roberta Offsie**) and also get all your SI questions answered. (grades 2-12)

<u>Getting started with Acellus:</u> From creating an account to understanding how Acellus can transform classrooms, this session is specific to teachers who have not yet been trained. The session will focus on team teach mode and options for blending your instruction with Acellus.

<u>Leveraging PowerSchool to support Virtual Learning:</u> You know the basics, but this session will dive deeper into reporting features, accessing parent contact information, and more.

<u>CommonLit:</u> CommonLit is an online reading program used to monitor student growth and reading achievement. Learn how to roster classes, find resources, and analyze data using CommonLit. This program is mostly geared toward ELA teachers, but Science and Social Studies teachers will find it useful as well!

<u>Google Meet and LOOM:</u> Are you looking for new lesson recording options? Do you wish your students could present ideas with the touch of a button? Look no further. We think Loom is the answer you have been searching for. After attending this session, you will feel comfortable recording, editing, sharing and teaching in a way that makes virtual teaching easier!

Beginner Google Classroom / Slides [2-12]: This session is for you if you need assistance with Google Classroom: Creating topics (sections), assigning and checking assignments, scheduling assignments/posts, returning classwork for revision, generating a google meet link and posting on the stream, etc... This session will also provide assistance in Google Slides: importing and creating interactive resources with materials you already have, how to share slides with students, how to add text/video/audio/pictures/links, etc...

<u>Virtual Math Success [K-5]:</u> Learn tips and tricks on creating virtual assignments, hosting virtual math meetings, and utilizing digital resources to support student success while learning math.

<u>Making it Fun While Meeting Students' IEPs Virtually [K-5]:</u> Universal design, virtual accessibility, and meeting individual student needs are important aspects of creating continuous learning activities for students with IEPs - but all students will also benefit from these considerations! Come to discuss how technology can support your creation of fun, easy to navigate virtual activities.

SeeSaw [K-1]: During this session we will be discussing ideas on how to implement SeeSaw in the K-1 classroom.

<u>Exact Path Q&A</u>: Exact Path is an individualized learning tool for students K-12. <u>Acellus Grading and Monitoring:</u> This session is for teachers who are already using Acellus but who want to discuss ideas for more efficient grading and student monitoring.
