These plans are designed to support students who need to stay home. They are intentionally flexible and open-ended so that they can be used at any point during the school year, and can be modified to fit your students' and families' needs.

Choice boards are being utilized for these because of the flexibility they offer. Choice boards enable you as teachers to identify and use student interests and preferences to stimulate active learning and student engagement, while also allowing students choice in how they demonstrate their learning.

To use these plans, [make your own copy of this document](#) and modify away! Make sure there are enough copies of the "Assignment List" (found on page 3) for each day you anticipate a student being absent. For example, a student who will be out two school weeks will need 10 copies of the assignment list.

You will need to include choice boards for each of the content areas that you would like your students to cover, select them from the options below. (You could also create your own [Template 1](#) // [Template 2](#) // [Template 3](#)). We recommend including copies of the choice boards in the plans in addition to a link to a digital version, if possible, to allow students to access the information easily.

HOW TO WORK WITH YOUR STUDENT:

MATH CHOICE BOARD: This choice board includes math tasks for your student to complete to stay fresh on the math skills we have been learning this year. Select one activity per day.

READING: We have been working on our reading stamina in class. Reading at home is a great way for students to show off how hard they have been working. They can be in their own space, cozied up, and free from the distractions in class! They should be able to sustain independent reading for about 30 minutes at a time. You could also read with your student, or have them read to a sibling.

READING RESPONSE CHOICE BOARD: This is a simple way to get students to practice thinking about their reading. Have them select a prompt from the choices each day. They can respond by discussing with someone or writing it down.

WRITING PROMPT CHOICE BOARD: Like the reading response board, the writing response board is meant to get students writing. It gives them choices of prompts to respond to, pick one each day and have fun!

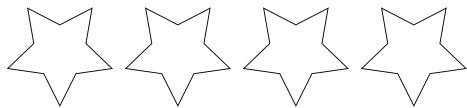
Assignment List
