Poise - appear calm and confident, avoid distracting behaviors

Voice - speak every word clearly, use the correct volume for your space

Life - express with passion and emotions with your voice

Eye contact - connect visually with the audience, look at each audience member

Gestures - use hand motions, move your body, have an expression on your face

Speed - talk with appropriate speed, use pauses for effect

HARD SKILLS

In addition to social skills, students learn how to cooperate in a group with diverse thinkers and learners, students learn to listen for understanding and not listen to simply respond. In a STEM environment, students learn how to identify and solve the real world problems of today. Simply having a background in working with a team to complete a project is different than learning to collaborate as a team, take on a particular role, and reach out to community members. The understanding of networks and building community partnerships as they relate to STEM is essential for success.
