

Welcoming and Affirming Communities Unit Prep Day

Background

The Welcoming and Affirming Communities Units were created from the following understandings:

- The need to address the current context of: reentry into the school setting after COVID 19, Shelter-in-Place, and Distance Learning, and related trauma for our communities and to support teachers to continue to centralize the needs of English Learners.
- The importance of creating strong relationships, first and foremost, with students and their families and attending to them throughout the year to create an affirming, safe, and caring learning community, clearly indicated by all research during this time.
- The themes that are embedded in these units, around identity, diversity, respect, inclusion, equity, and anti-bias should be threaded through the remaining content of the year, and this may involve modifying units, reflecting on them to make sure they include diverse perspectives representative of our schools and communities.
- Because of the topic and nature of some of the strategies, it is critical to look at the
 materials ahead of time to develop understanding of the content. That background
 knowledge will inform how you want to connect with students around the content and even
 what you may implement in your classroom. (You are free to modify the materials for your
 context, students, and community needs.)

Teaching Materials to be Created

 - Narrative Input
 - Draw and Labels
 - Read alouds and other literature embedded in strategies
 - Chants
- We encourage you to divide up prepping the strategies for delivery to the degree possible.
- Units also incorporate the use of some materials that need to be printed. We have advised your administrators of this.
