Driving Question: How can we teach children to be stewards of the environment?

## Research:

- Interview a younger student to identify his/her favorite animal and children's book.
- Develop a fictional children's book about the animal and its <u>ecosystem</u> using <u>ecological concepts</u> to drive the plot. While writing the book, learn about the structure of plot in children's books. Include:
  - a. Structure of a plot
    - i. Introduction
    - ii. Rising action
    - iii. Conflict
    - iv. Climax
    - v. Falling action
    - vi. Resolution
  - b. How this structure parallels human impacts on the environment
    - i. Rising action being the introduction of a human-made impact on the ecosystem
    - ii. Resolution being the remediation of a human-made impact

<u>Assignment & Audience</u>: Write a children's book about environmental issues with illustrations, along with an artist's statement explaining the ecological concepts in more detail. Create a video that the younger student can watch and listen to your book read aloud to them.

<u>Next Generation Science Standard</u>: Learn about the *specific ecosystem that is the focus of the book*, food webs, ecosystem interactions, resources, and human impact on the environment. In addition, evaluate the *best ways to remediate the human effect on an ecosystem* and include that best method *in the resolution of the book*.
