


With the Bears lined up in a Wide rush front, the box is light. With the Lions lined up in empty, the Bears are not worried about a run threat. Goff almost never gets a designed run called.

The Lions use a short like flip to St Brown working back inside as the ball carrier for the Short Trap. Short Trap is a great concept against a Wide front.

## Game Planning With The 2023 Detroit Lions

Around 2Q 12:20, the Lions call a Pin/Pull concept to pick up a 3<sup>rd</sup> and 3. The Lions are putting together quite the list of run plays they've converted on 3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> and mediums so far this year.

Pin/Pull is a great play call against fronts that like to move/stunt.




By flexing the tight end out, the offense has a better angle at pinning the defensive end. This gives the tight end leverage for the block.

## Game Planning With The 2023 Detroit Lions

The Lions convert a 3<sup>rd</sup> & 3 at about 1Q 11:50 with a Tackle Trap. The Cowboys line up in a 5-down rush front with Micah Parsons (11) lined up as an interior rusher.



The Lions love run calls on third and mediums. With the Cowboys lined up in a rush front, Tackle Trap is a sound call.

The Lions pick up the line movement. The PSG steps to help the Center on a double team before working up to the Mike. The PST is patient and waits for Parsons to stunt inside, and washes him down.

The RPO and short motion from the Z receiver round out
