ROCKING IN MY SCHOOL SHOES


Objectives: to explore the rhythms, the rhymes, and the rests in Pete the Cat, Rocking in My School Shoes

Directions: Listen and watch the video story of Pete the Cat, Rocking in My School Shoes. Complete one of the activities listed below. You do NOT have to turn anything in this week!

WHAT TO LISTEN FOR: rhyming words and the repeated "chorus" part ("I'm rocking in my school shoes!) Notice that there's a small break in between the words "rocking" and "in!" In music, that is called a "rest." It means that there's a beat of silence. It looks like this:



Click on the book cover and link below to hear Pete the Cat, Rocking in My School Shoes! Don't forget to listen for the "rest!"



Did you find the rest? Listen to the story a second time. Every time you hear the sung part, "I'm rocking (or playing or reading) in my school shoes," bring your pointer finger to your lips and make the "shh!" noise during the rest!

"I'm rocking



In my school shoes"

Or

"I'm reading



In my school shoes!"

OR

"I'm eating



In my school shoes!"

## **OTHER ACTIVITIES:**

- 1. Draw your favorite pair of school shoes. What color are they?
- 2. If your school is also your home— make a list with a parent of the places YOUR shoes (or slippers) go!
- 3. Listen to the story again and sing along when they get to the "rocking" part!
