
I. After-School Tutoring and Friday Enrichment Survey Results (152 responses)

Which school does your student attend? (please fill out a separate survey for each student attending Socorro Consolidated Schools)




Beginning August 27th, we will have Friday Enrichment activities for students. Do you plan on sending your student to school on Fridays? Bussing is provided.

II. Assessments this Year to Track Student Progress

- a. **ECOT** (Early Childhood Observation Tool)

 PreK students. ECOT gathers information on what children know and can do at the time of preschool entry and document growth over the preschool year.
- b. **KOT** (Kindergarten Observation Tool)
 Kindergarten students. KOT gathers information on what children know and can do at the time of kindergarten entry. It is only administered at the beginning of the year.
- c. **WIDA Screener** (World-Class Instructional Design and Assessment)
 Given to all students initially enrolling in NM public schools. WIDA is an English language proficiency assessment given to new students to help educators identify whether they are English language learners (ELLs).

d. Istation

K-2nd grade students. This is a state required assessment for reading and math. For reading, Istation assesses the National Reading Panel's Big Five foundational essentials (phonemeic awareness, phonics, fluency, comprehension, and vocabulary). For math, Istation asses students on grade level Common Core State Standards.

- e. **iMSSA** (Interim Measures of Student Success Achievement) 3rd 8th grade students. The iMSSA provides information about whether students have
 - 3rd 8rd grade students. The iMSSA provides information about whether students have achieved end-of-year grade-level standards as defined by Common Core State Standards. It will be administered 3 times this year prior to taking the MSSA.
- f. MSSA (Measures of Student Success Achievement)
 - $3^{\rm rd}$ $8^{\rm th}$ grade students. MSSA is the state summative assessment in math and English language arts, aligned to the New Mexico Common Core State Standards for math and language arts.
- g. MAP (Measures of Academic Progress)
 - 9th 12th grade students. MAP test is an adaptive achievement and growth test. It creates personalized assessment by adapting to each student's learning level—measuring progress and growth for each student. It will be given 3 times this year: beginning of the year, mid-year, and end of year. Because the state iMSSA assessments are only for grades 3-8, this will give us data on our 9th-11th grade students.

h. MasteryConnect


 $K-12^{th}$ grade students. MasteryConnect is a competency-based learning platform that helps teachers identify levels of understanding, target students for intervention, and inform instruction. It allows teachers to track students understanding of all grade level standards. This will be used primarily as a formative assessment.


III. Library Update



IV. Research Experience for Teachers (RET)

Three Socorro Consolidated School teachers participated in the Research Experience for Teachers this summer. RET was hosted by the NMT Mechanical Engineering, Materials Engineering, and Chemical Engineering Department. The three teacher participants learned new research techniques and topics which are incorporated into new lesson plans for implementation in their classrooms at Parkview Elementary (Mary Edwina Yalnaty), Sarracino Middle School (Avelonia Quarrie), and Socorro High School (Melba Aguilar). They presented their research on July 30th at NMT.
