

HS Bocce Club Terminology

Open Play – is for Club Members to meet at the courts and play with others in individual or team play. Show up and play.

League Play – Club Teams playing against each other at specific times on an ongoing basis.

Tournament Play – Club organized periodic event where teams play in a series of games to finalize a winner

I have been asked how tournaments are played.

Hopefully this will explain it to you.

The way we play tournaments is the same as our league playoffs with one exception. and that is how we determine ranking.

Both are single elimination half day events. (if your team loses you no longer play). Only winning teams move forward.

League playoffs are played based upon league standing at the end of the season. Teams will play each other and move up if they win .Winners continue to move up until there are two teams left and they play for the championship.

Tournaments are played the same as the playoffs only the ranking is determined by luck of the draw. The tournament manager will have a blind draw which will determine your ranking and starting position.

What is HS Open Play Bocce and how does it work?

Open play times are reserved Bocce Club times primarily for individuals looking to meet at the court and play with other club members.

We have currently reserved and scheduled the West Court (next to the parking area).

1. Go onto our website at www.hsboceclub.com click on the Event Page, (access is on the upper right corner) Look at the Event Calendar and determine the date(s) you want to play. Click on the Gray Button below.

The Signup will come up. Select the day and how many players you are signing up and a note if you desire. You will also see if there are others that are also signed up to play. We have set a limit of 8. If more than 8 show up they can use the East Court on a first come first serve basis.
